Planters Warned to be Prepared.

WARDING OFF ATTACKS.

Steps Necessary in Order to Safeguard Crops.

The coffee industry is at present threatened by a serious menage in the form of awarms of locusts which it is feared may attack some of the oldest planting districts, particularly those close to Nairobi.

The seriousness of such an attack cannot be over estimated since if a swarm attacked a coffee shamba the loss, largely from breakage of branches, would be very considerable.

The Department of Agriculture has therefore issued a circular, signed by the Senior Coffee Officer, suggesting methods which may be taken now in order that planters may be prepared to fight an attack. It is suggested that planters will be well advised to make preparations immediately.

Huge swarms of locusts have descended on the Laiki-pia district where the outlook is said to be very serious.

Native Reserves Suffer Heavily.

COFFEE IN ITHANGA DEFOLIATED.

Large Flying Swarm in Thompson's Falls Area.

The latest information is far from reassuring in regard to the locust menace in Kenya
