

The Lords' Debate.

We publish this morning a re port of the March debate by the House of Lords upon the Cleser Union Report. As the debate was the first public consideration of the document in authoritative circles, it has a definite and speeial value. It was initiated by Lord Lugard, an old African administrator who retains his chief contact with the Empire in Africa through the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations at Geneva. Lord Lugard is now 70 years of age and in his long ex perience of African conditions he secumulated a vast store of lifetime of service have been preserved in the pages of classiwork for students of racial problems in Africa Lord Lagard's earliest connexions with East Africa were not those of an administrator: they were largely military in their character. 



Complete Boycott Urged as Protest Against Communal Representation. OPPOSITION TO CLAIMS OF THE SETTLERS.

Indian Government Invited to Institute Educational and Agricultural Enquiries in East Africa.

Nearly twenty resolutions were adopted by the eighth session of the E.A. Indian National Congress at

The Congress supported the principle of paramountey of Native Interests and welcomed the Commission's refusal to agree to settlers' self-government aspira-tions.

They also asked that Indians should be numbered among those selected to represent Native Interests on the Legislature.

Opposition was expressed to political federation but economic co-ordination was favoured.

The retention of the official majority in the Kenya Legis-

retention of the ometa majority in the action 12-ac-salure was orged. Congress asked the imperial Government definitely to accept the Common Roll principle and to premulgate it as soon as possible.

It was also myed that one of the Private Secretaries of the Central Authority should be an Indian. The Government of India is mixed to send an education expert to East Africa to recommend improvements in the system, an agricultural arport to active on Isad situation for Indian colonisation and a depotation to their Indians in presenting their case to a High Com-

A. Governments are asked to abandon their neglect Indian education and it is proposed that the Kenya lucation Cess be abolished.

Additional Indian representation on the Legislative Council of Ugands is recommended.

An Indian Trade Commissioner in E.A. is urged and the establishment of an Information Bureau in India.

Finally the Cogress recommends a complete bycott of all public bodies in Kerys, including municipalities, as a protest against command franchise. Complete equality is again demanded in every direction and the opening of higher Civil Service posts to indians to sociate the community more closely in the work of Government.






