Tanganyika Native Policy.

When His Excellency the Governor returned to London a month ago, we suggested that he should state the advisability of a frank reply to his critics, especially those who were opposing the progress of the Native Policy in the Territory and the general attitude of Government towards white settlement. This morning we published questions and answers during the most recent session of the Tanganyika Legislative Council, which we suggest, indicate very clearly the line of thought which was pursued by the non-official section of the European population in the Mandated Territory. It should be remembered that the questions were asked only a few days after the arrival of His Excellency in the country and, although he was presented, on stepping ashore, with a full statement of the main criticisms as voiced by the European Constitutional Association, it would be unusual to suggest that Sir Donald Macdonald, who was then acting as the Chief Secretary representing the Government, was not well prepared to answer the questions. We are aware that since the discussion in the Legislative Council, the Governor agreed to meet a delegation from the European Constitutional Association; that as a result of the discussion, the Association undertook to prepare a memorandum and, if His Excellency so desired, to present it to the Secretary of State for the Colonies. As a further indication of the willingness of His Excellency to meet the views of the non-official population upon the problems of official opinion, we recently received notice from the Secretary of the Administration to meet the system of up-country delegates and representatives of the various communities to place before Sir Donald Macdonald. The tenor of the question directed to Government by a responsible nominated European Representative in the Legislative Council was exactly the same as that which we have just quoted. We believe and we hope that Sir Donald Macdonald will be followed by a similar policy in the Mandated Territory. The Hon. N. F. Howe-Kemp referred to his question in support of urgent and maladministration. He referred to "serious delinquencies" in respect of Native Treaties. He referred to "incompetent subversion of Administrative authority," to reports (generally denied) that certain officers had been relieved from office through criticism of the native policy and in opposition by native authorities. We are aware that the Governor is not disposed, by the Governor and Government depends upon its officials. In reports of conditions in the Territory, the Hon. N. F. 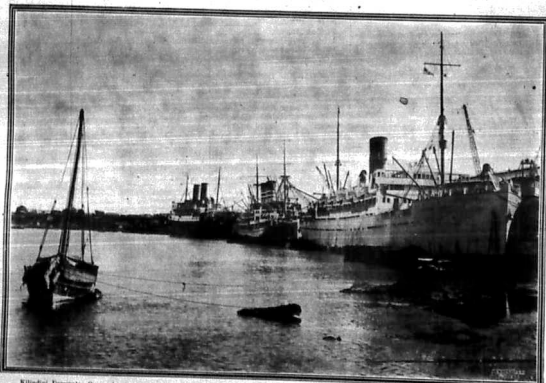

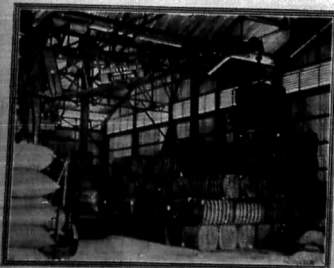

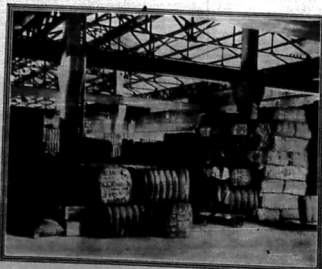

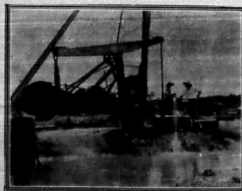

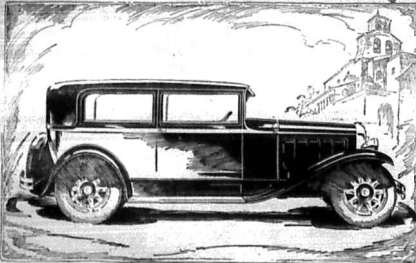


A view of Timboko, the highest point on the Kenya & Uganda Railway, 9,200 ft.

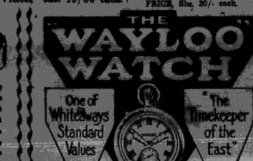
