The Hide and Skin Trade.

The announcement from the headquarters of the East African Steam Shipping Conference in London that from August 1 there will be "important substantial" increases in the freight rates charged for hides and skins, has brought protests from the Hides and Skins Section of the Mombasa Chamber of Commerce. Not only is the proposed increase considerable, it has apparently the effect, at first sight, of discouraging a correspondent towards consideration of shipping options which has been made possible through the more prompt packing and taking of the hides and skins. It is probable that improvement in packing has reached to the benefit of the trader and proportionately diminished the receipts obtained by the shipping companies for the carriage. It is to be noted that the proposed increase in a way major degree is offset by the Shipping Companies' request for a temporary lease caused by an operation which is calculated to restrict the future trade. The report that the local adjudicator of the Hides and Skins Conference has advised the reasons for the unexpected increase is important at this juncture to discuss the reasons prompting the London office in charge of the East African Steam Shipping Companies' proposal to increase their rates. The proposal is based on the assumption. The Shipping Companies have played no part in the development of East Africa—then at considerable loss in seeking the general assistance of collection—the port of East Africa and of the shipping services are bound up to interests. This common ground of interest is the best lead for the initiation of the discussion of the freight rates. It will serve a useful preliminary purpose, pending further information, to place emphasis upon the importance and value of the hides and skins trade. The trade is almost entirely in the hands of native producers in the various of the continental side of Africa, co-existence with ranching operations. Most African producers are headed by headquarters of the Mombasa Chamber of Commerce. It is a trade which Mombasa has a peculiarly important part although, as an industry, hides and skins do not come within the field of enterprise of white settlement. Many holders of the proprietary value to Kenya alone may be gauged from the fact that in the year 1917-28 the value of hides of native origin were valued at £200,000 and of skins at £100,000. It is to be noted that the exportation of hides and skins from Mombasa amounted to £1,200,000. The increase in the value of the hides and skins trade in 1920 is compared with the previous year the astonishing figure of £285,298. Uganda, in 1920 exported hides and skins worth a quarter of a million pounds, in comparison with only £100,000 in 1917. Last year the value of the hides from Tanganyika for re-export through Mombasa was £1,000,000. It is apparent from these figures that the trade is one of great importance to Mombasa, the collecting centre for a very large area. During recent years all the East African Governments, in co-

BLOW TO EAST AFRICAN HIDES AND SKINS TRADE.

A Freight Increase of 66 Per Cent.

(SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT.)
Mombasa, Friday.
The Mombasa Chamber of Commerce has protested against the increase in the freight on hides and skins which has been announced by the Homeward Shipping Committee, Nairobi.
The situation is regarded most seriously in Mombasa where it is considered that the increase of the freight by 66 per cent. will strike a severe blow at an important trade.

Actually the Homeward Shipping Committee referred to in the above message has not yet met, following official suggestion the East African Steamship Company, Nairobi, has requested the Executive of the Association of East African Governments to convene a meeting in conjunction with representatives of producing interests at a homeward shipping committee to be held in Nairobi. It is considered that the Executive of the Association of East African Governments should be invited to discuss the work of the committee.

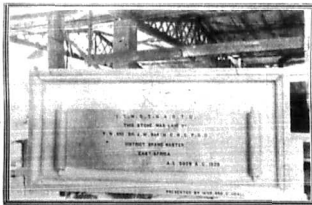

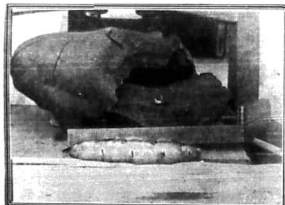

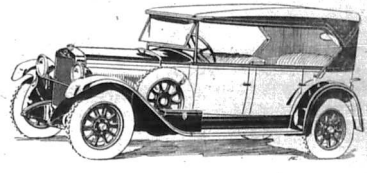
