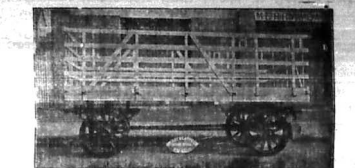

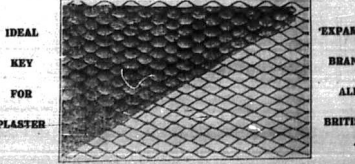

UGANDA TRAFFIC AND NEW ROADS LAWS.
Bad Connecting Link With Tanganyika.

"STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT. Kampala, June 8.—The rails have been testing out roads severely during the past two months and, as the traffic increases every day, it is not to be wondered at that the surfaces have suffered in many places. Potholes and corrugations are numerous but these are being dealt with by the road gangs and letter surfaces should be evident shortly. But the authorities have not to make that some form of more permanent highways will have to be sanctioned in the near future. If we are to keep our good names for the best roads in East Africa. The regulation that no motor vehicle shall be used on any road after the 30th of this month is going to make a very great difference to these damaged surfaces more than anything else.

The road from Mamba to Bukoba, from the Tanganyika border onwards, is practically impassable since the rains set in. During the past few weeks many men and horses have succumbed on this road and with the very greatest difficulty managed to struggle into Bukoba. In some cases the drivers would not risk the return journey and loaded their vehicles

on to the Lake steamer, taking them off at Bukoba, the port for Mamba, and continuing the journey to Kampala by road. It is certainly a scandal that the most important district in Northern Tanganyika at this rate probably even in this whole Territory is not to be served during the most important matter of reasonably possible highways.

Highways Ordinance. A select Committee of the Uganda Chamber of Commerce has been busy on the draft Highways Ordinance. Their report, which has just been issued, is a very comprehensive document comprising twenty-one pages, suggested alterations, additions and deletions. The report commences by stating that the experience of the bill will be well commensurate with gratitude and notes that it contains legislation on many matters which has long since been required. It continues—

"We are of opinion that most of it is not nearly all of the cases in which the Public find any real difficulty in carrying out their duties are those which they are called upon to enforce, not that it contains legislation on matters of which are regarded as venial either because the law is obsolete or because it imposes what is felt to be an unnecessary restriction upon public liberty. The section behind the reference to action may be a Statute, but the action behind the Statute is public opinion and if the Public sanction the Statute in the Uganda Chamber which has not that sanction the Statute is necessarily, though illogically, to be the sanction of the Police and the Public. The Police enforces

the necessity of legislation not being in advance of public opinion and the impetuosity of the reaction of laws which have ceased to command the ungrudging support of the public opinion. The draft Bill seems altogether identical to the Ordinance in force in Kenya and the Committee have suggested the removal of a number of anomalies which at present exist. For instance, it is recommended that on driving a motor vehicle it shall be necessary to carry a driver's licence to be held. Though this is already written in Kenya on this matter, we believe, and it does seem ridiculous that a driver should take out a competency certificate for every make of car he wishes to drive. Surely the owner of a Nash can drive a Buicklike just as well?"

One point stands out in regard to the introduction of this legislation. As the Committee point out the reform is welcomed, but it is not much use "improving" roads if they are not kept in good repair. There is sufficient to cope with the present roads, much less have a comprehensive Highways Ordinance added to his burden. No doubt economy in staff could be introduced but the fact remains that when this bill comes into force, the Force could easily employ another twelve men for repaired work and there is no doubt that they would pay their arrears in addition to the fees already paid and appear in the files of the Traffic Department in a very short space of time. As on the other hand, sufficient staff is not available for the enforcement of the Ordinance, it is waste of time passing it into law.

PROPOSED ESTABLISHMENT OF COFFEE INSTITUTE.
C. P. U. to Discuss the Subject.

A special general meeting of the Coffee Planters' Union of Kenya and East Africa will be held at the Memorial Hall, Nairobi, on Friday, June 21, commencing at 10.30 a.m.

It is intended on the agenda are discussed methods and policy. The main intention, however, will be to give two resolutions introduced by Mr. Burgeon, of the Nairobi Coffee Cultivators Company. These are as follows—

1. That the Coffee Laboratory be established by an Institute to be controlled by Government.

2. That a sub-committee be appointed to consider the establishment of methods and objects of the proposed Institute—the Director of Agriculture to be a member of this sub-committee.

In forwarding his motion Mr. Burgeon stated that the formation of a Coffee Institute under Government control would be based on coffee planters, coffee merchants, millers and warehouse agents.

Among the objects to be considered by the proposed Institute are the following—

1. That the present Union and its branches shall be dissolved.

2. That the coffee services of the Department of Agriculture shall be taken over by the industry as a whole which shall be controlled and improved.

Local sales shall be organized; other houses at Kilimaniro and Pangani shall be kept in touch with; public relations and requirements of the industry shall be improved; training and managing agents shall be licensed; coffee distillations shall be kept and branches of the Institutes shall be established as required.

Reorganized Services.

It is further suggested that the Institute will recognize the coffee services under the following headings—Administration of the Coffee Laws and supervision of coffee plantations; the establishment of research services; the establishment of cultural services; the control of seed; the establishment and control of licensed warehouses; the establishment and control of local Marketing Societies; the provision of arbitrators; the establishment of the Coffee Ordinance; the annual registration fee of Shgs. 50; per estate; the collection of other fees, etc.

It is proposed that the Institute would obtain its funds in the following manner—The Institute would take over the existing vote to the Department of Agriculture and would levy on its planter members a contribution of Shs. 15. 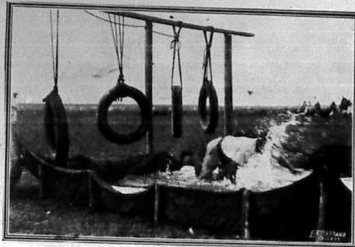
