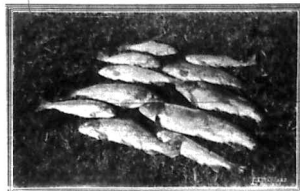

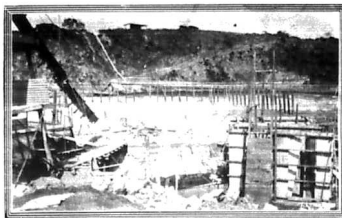

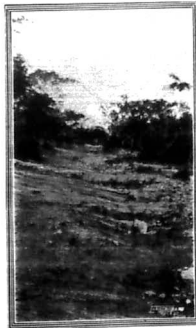

In ordinary it was a short pitched ball, was swung, and seemed to strike the batsman above the knee. As these batsmen are becoming frequent I feel it must enter a protest. It is a fact that to obtain a L.B.W. batsman the ball must be pitched in a line with the wicket. A bowler delivering round the wicket, unless he breaks back considerably, must pitch outside the line to hit the wicket and cannot therefore claim a L.B.W. decision (unless, of course, the ball is pitched over the popping crease; it is then possible). In my humble opinion there is one bowler in the country who breaks sufficiently to get a batsman L.B.W. when bowling round the wicket. I have a request most cordially from the Indian bowler above referred to. I am open to conviction and will look forward to a reply from you Sir, or any of your readers, with interest.

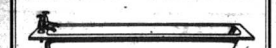

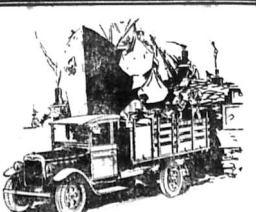

Noxious Weeds.

LACK OF LEGISLATION TO DEAL WITH THEM.

In the Legislative Council on Tuesday, Captain the Hon. E. M. V. Kenyal (West Kenya) said: "Will Government state its intention and practice in preventing the growth of Noxious Weeds, viz. S. Margat, Habbish (Khang), adaman or wild cucumber?" The Director of Agriculture replied: "No legislation for dealing with such Noxious Weeds as the Indian Khat, viz. Habbish exists at present in this Colony, and having regard to the considerable area in which such weeds are prevalent on inspection and other directions for their extermination, it is not the Government's intention that legislation at present is being considered to deal with such weeds as are continuously to be met with by Local Councils."

"We have been asked in the Press and in other ways to proceed to controlling the spread of the Noxious Weeds. The growing of Habbish or Indian Khat is prohibited under the Abuse of Opium Prohibition Rules. It is not regarded from a purely agricultural point of view as a noxious weed."

The reference to "Sudam or Wild Tobacco" is understood. The Hon. Member may recall that at a recent meeting of the Convention of Agriculturists a motion requesting legislative and administrative action for purposes of dealing with noxious weeds was adopted.

Captain Kenyal—What contented the Department of Agriculture over the growth of weeds on railway premises, and if the Government does not consider it necessary to deal with them some means being taken in the near future, any legislation enabling it to do so, how is it that the department can deal with locusts, under the terms of the Plague Ordinance?

The Director of Agriculture—I should require notice of that somewhat lengthy question. Nothing has been done by the Department as regards the Railway Administration of the purchase price of weeds growing within the area covered by the Administration.

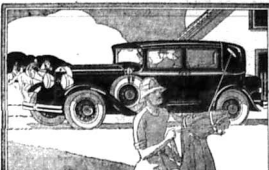

Indians in Kenya.

To the Editor, "E. A. Standard"—
Mr. H. M. has appeared in the "East African Standard" and the latest edition of the Legislative Council of the Legislative Assembly, we are obliged to issue the following statement to the press.

1. Time and again the Indian community have made absolutely clear that the present movement for the securing of the common franchise is not based on any ideal of non-cooperation, which is essentially and fundamentally different from non-cooperation in its present connotation.

2. Non-cooperation as understood by the author, is a movement aimed towards the paralysis of the Government, and effective obstruction of its machinery. A number of instances have been cited in which non-cooperation has assisted and even aided the Government in carrying out its policy.

3. Non-cooperation as understood by the author is a movement of spiritual purification and uplift. It is a movement which is aimed towards the improvement of the individual or institution which it concerns. The Indian community here has never laid claim to any non-cooperation movement in Kenya. Its non-participation has not been aimed either towards the members of the Government or any particular official, either the Europeans or Indians.

4. The Congress of December 1917 revived the question of a Common Franchise for the Indians as before the publication of the Government's announcement that owing to the expense of the past, instead of following the method of expediting the present and participating in the Legislature, as they had decided to do in 1918, they would remain outside till the Imperial Government had given an affirmative decision. They were not to be given any vote.

5. The occasion for revisiting the decision of 1917 has not yet finally decided their policy. Now all those that refuse to fall into line with Indian aspirations, who still holding Indians, whether on the Executive of the K.C.A.A. outside it, are doing their best to establish points of contact both with the European community and the Government in all departments of civic and political life of the Colony, and are more than anxious to establish the harmonious relations which exist between the Indian and European in the past and common should develop further in spite of the political differences of views. We are quite sure that so soon as the Imperial Government has decided its attitude on the question of franchise, the Indian community will continue to hold the whole position from the point of view of the interests of the Colony as a whole, and not any communal or racial spirit.

6. Much of course will depend on the nature of the decision reached and the attitude adopted by the latter community. Meanwhile, we are in touch with the other communities in the Colony and with the Government. With this fact in view it is the belief of the Indian community that the Indians are non-co-operating.

7. As the variety of the allegations made in this column and the variety of the attacks and the speech under reference, we have been led to the following:

(a) The K.C.A.A. manifesto has been faithfully reported and carried out even by the alleged non-cooperators.

Mombasa and Elbert are admitted by this self-appointed Executive of trust and Hon. Mr. O'Shea.

There have been no deductions from the K.C.A.A. and those who have been so designated as present have never been expelled from the K.C.A.A. or any mass meeting held in connection therewith. The Indian Community and they have not withdrawn from any meeting either the K.C.A.A. or the Indian Community. Mr. Pankaj is leaving India.

Finally the programme which has taken place at the level called the "Indian" point of view represents an objective and a self and his indifference to it. It is a declaration of intention to complete the position rather than to be in the solution.

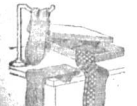
