**Nairobi Municipal Committee**

**THE ESTIMATES.**

A special meeting of the Township Committee was held on Tuesday, March 19th, at the C. V. O.'s dispensary, for the discussion and passing of the Draft Estimates of the Municipality for the current year. Among those present were Messrs. B. Humphrey (in the chair), A. C. Tanshill, T. Wood, W. K. Nottley, S. Couper, H. P. Epie, D. Beaton, V. M. Newland, and the Town Clerk (Mr. J. A. Watson).

The minutes of the Estimates occupied the attention of the Committee for the greater part of the afternoon. As yet, the Estimates are of a private nature and on the various sections being made will be despatched to the Secretariat.

**BUILDING RULES.**

Building rules were also submitted for discussion and on the 19th, March 19th, Mr. Newland, moving a resolution that the local Architects be informed that building rules are to be enforced and that they could on application procure a copy of the rules, further that he motioned that any criticism should be welcome and that a copy of the same also to be sent to the P. W. D. It was agreed.

**SHINGLES.**

A discussion arose as to whether the use of shingles as a roofing should be prohibited or not. After considerable argument, Mr. Newland proposed that the rule be refrained allowing residential carriers the use of shingles provided that it is not within a hundred feet of any neighbouring house.

**CONCRETE FLOORING.**

The question as to the advisability of enforcing concrete being done up for local buildings was discussed and it was decided that the rule be refrained, allowing for buildings that are erected on piles.

The meeting adjourned without further discussion.

**Parliament Prorogued**

Address from Throne.

The Effect of Increasing Armaments.

£1,000,000 COTTON CULTIVATION LOAN TO BUDAN.

(Reuter's Special to "The A. Standard") London, March 11.

The morning of the prorogation of Parliament and the Royal procession to Westminster opened with a drizzling rain that later in the day cleared away. Unfortunately the weather did not allow the Londoners from making a holiday to witness the ever interesting scenes of the closing of the Houses of Parliament. Dense crowds gathered in the streets, and the members of the House of Parliament along the Mall and Whitehall. Their Majesties received a great ovation and bowed their acknowledgments. The carriage horses, which were a royal salute at St James' Park, announced the arrival of the procession at the House of Lords. The usual brilliant escort of the great officers of State accompanied Their Majesties to their throne in the Lower Chamber. The House was thronged with a huge gathering of Peers and Peersess and many other notables. The scene presented a magnificent display of colour and jewellery. His Majesty entered the House wearing the Imperial Crown for the first time since its accession. Her Majesty the Queen wore a small diamond crown, and her robes were of crimson with a coronet that was encrusted with diamonds, including amongst them the famous Stars of Africa.

**ATTEMPTS TO PETITION THE KING.**

Five suffragettes were arrested at Whitehall while attempting to petition the King. The petition intended to be presented expressed their protest against the Government's intention of the Government to introduce a coercion bill against the women. An aide declared that the women must have the law in it to be accepted. The King's petition hopes that the bill will therefore be promised in the speech from the throne.

A septuagenarian was also arrested while attempting to petition the King on the distress of the poor.

**THE DEBATE ON THE ADDRESS.**

In the debate on the address in the House of Commons Mr. Bonar Law said that he would welcome the assurance that the Balkan war was to be speedily terminated. The world's increase in the armaments had its danger in that it would lead to a race together. He hoped that the closer union would be carried still further. He emphasized that nobody was satisfied with the condition of the British land forces. The Government had made some reference as to the question. He believed that if the Submarine experiment was successful it would prove a direct advantage to the British fleet. The Opposition leader omitted pointing out that no reference had been made in the speech on the carrying out of the Parliament Act. He asked what would be done with regard to Home rule in Ulster. Mr. Asquith said that the deliberations of the Ambassadors had resulted in agreement on two vital points. The first was the question of the diplomatic relations of the Powers were unanimous in accepting an autonomous Albania under a guarantee from Europe. He regards his frontiers, especially the Balkans, were not only one or two points, which were not vital, which still required to secure complete concord of the Powers. The Powers were at present awaiting the Allies' reply with reference to their offer of mediation. He was glad that Rumania and Bulgaria were in the process of availing themselves of the mediation of the Powers. The diplomatic grouping of the Powers had become increasingly cordial. Powers like ourselves who were less directly interested in the near East have co-operated earnestly to find a path to agreement for all concerned. We have worked with a single-minded desire with Germany. That co-operation had not only made the path of diplomacy more pleasant to travel and broken the ice that had required a great deal of confidence which would continue between those two great nations.

The British Premier paid a tribute to the ability of all concerned for the maintenance of the Powers and the Ambassadors at the Conference. And he paid tribute also to the Edward Grey for his unexampled patience and resolution and sagacity. He thought of Mr. Bonar Law in whatever we think of the

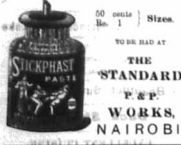
