PERSONAL NOTES AND NEWS.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.]

London, August 13. The announcement in connection with the Kenya Treasury Bill appeared in all the papers on Wednesday morning. The invitation on the part of the Colonial Secretary for the Colonies for tenders for £1,000,000 of Kenya Treasury Bills for three months' Treasury Bills received a new departure in Kenya Government finance. It is the first time that tenders for bills have been placed by tender on the London market through the Crown Agents. It is, of course, known that the bills were being issued to meet temporarily the cost of railway, harbour and other works for the development of the Colony, and the cost is a stated will eventually be provided by the issue of a loan. The last Kenya loan was in May 1926, when £2,500,000 of 4 per cent. Issued bonds 1926 was issued at 95 per cent. The other loans outstanding are the £2,000,000 6 per cent. Loan 1946-50 issued at 62 per cent. in 1921, and the £3,000,000 5 per cent. Loan 1948-50, issued at 94 per cent. in 1927, so that the total Kenya loans outstanding at present amount to £13,000,000. The "Times" remarks "Conditions are favourable for borrowers in good credit standing by the issue of bills, for the Colony should be able to place them on satisfactory terms."

All reports indicate that the interest in the Antwerp Exhibition continues unabated. 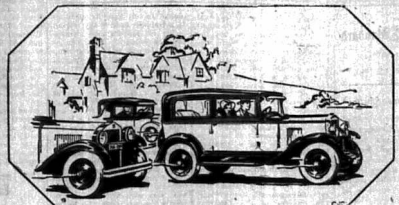

**EXTENSION OF THE CATHEDRAL.**

**Important Ceremony in Nairobi To-morrow.**

**COMPLETION OF THE NAVE.**

**H.E. The Governor to Lay Foundation Stone of South Tower.**

Important ceremony will take place at the Highlands Cathedral, Nairobi, to-morrow, when His Excellency the Governor of Kenya, Sir Edward Frigg, will lay the foundation stone of the South Tower.

He will initiate a further extension of the building which, with the part originally built during the war and lately added to, will complete the Nave and add to the dignity and grace of the building designed by one of the world's most eminent architects of Church buildings.

The ceremony this morning, takes place at 10.30 and will be attended by the Mayor and Councillors of the Capital.

**A CIVIC OCCASION.**

The temporary part of the building which has been in use for several years has been removed and the two new towers have been laid, making five in all and closed again by another temporary structure. This completes the Nave.

Following the laying of the foundation stone of the South Tower tomorrow it is intended to carry the building up by the same means which is the last and lower roof of the Nave. This will give extra height to the tower.

On the other side, in the North Tower, the work is being done which will greatly improve the appearance of the Cathedral.

It is hoped that money will be forthcoming in the amount of the work now in hand. It is expected that the work now in hand will be completed in the next few weeks and the roof being the two towers constructed.

On the subject has already received the receipt of donations amounting to £4,500 which has enabled the present extension to be undertaken.

It is also expected that there will be a large number of contributions of the general public to participate in this important occasion in the history of the Church in the Empire.

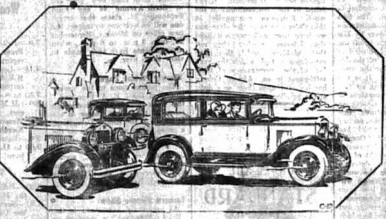

Magisterial Enquiry Adjourned.

The magisterial enquiry at Kijabe in regard to the murder of Miss Hilda Stump was adjourned on Thursday, after 22 witnesses had been examined.

Two Alternatives to the Backhand Stroke.

In a previous article the top spin forehand was discussed at length. Concomitant with this study of some of its uses, it would also be well to consider the top spin shot.
