FRANCO-ITALIAN NAVAL PROBLEM SOLVED.

Successful End to British Efforts.

FIVE POWER PACT.

Agreement Subject to Approval of Other Signatories.

The virtual settlement of long-standing differences between France and Italy which at the London Naval Conference prevented the conclusion of a Five Power Naval Agreement, is announced. This has been brought about by what has been described as "Mr. Henderson's Travelling Conference" which after consultations in Paris went on to Rome where the British Foreign Minister had long talks with Signor Mussolini.

A Big Step Forward.

It is hoped from an official announcement to the effect that it is a step which has been found for the conclusion of a Five Power Agreement, no details are available.

It was the idea for Franco-Italian admission to the full London Naval Treaty. Mr. Henderson's visit to Paris, where it is hoped that they will be able finally to discuss the deal.

Official Statement. Rome, later. A communique has been issued from the British Embassy stating that the British Government has been unable to agree on the terms of the proposed agreement which were left out of the London Naval Conference.

Road and Weather Report.

Mr. Graham-Smith writes as follows:—

The dry hot weather all last week has culminated in a series of heavy downpours, at intervals throughout the week.

The heaviest rainfall reported is that which fell at Mombasa, just under 4 1/2 inches, at Mombasa Road and Empire 4 1/2 and Tavo with just under 4 1/2.

The remaining stations in Kenya report varying rainfalls from 3 1/2 down to just under 1 1/2.

In regard to the High Commissioner he said that in his own view there was almost complete separation between the two intended functions, but it was almost an axiom under the special conditions in East Africa that the double functions should be performed by one person, namely that the holding of the scale as arbiter in differences which might arise between the interests of the communities, and the coordinating of services.

He advocated that the powers of the High Commissioner should be advisory and not legislative. As a first step his powers should be limited, and later should be those of an Executive Governor-General assisted by an Advisory Council. His powers should not be advisory to a Central Legislature to deal with subjects of common interest.

He could not over-estimate the benefits of co-ordination of services. The union of the customs needed no argument. With the railways there had actually been instances of competition, while one control was necessary in regard to future road development. All territories would gain as a result.

As favoured a system of segregation of races in East Africa, but said that the whole question depended upon the choosing of the right measure of segregation. They must guard against the two extremes, and the happy medium was the system of reserves for the natives.

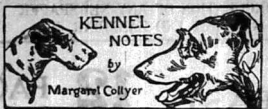

The Hilton replied that responsible gov-
ernments were a responsibility on the
part of government for the South
Africa on the present time. The
English wish to build now a establish-
ment which was appropriate to any
future they could foresee or which
would remedy the wrongs they expect
of action in the future which they
could not foresee.

Native Policy.

Lord Stanley then questioned
Sir Hilton on native policy. He
remarked that the Young Report
embodied the importance of an
organization in administration of
native policy. One of their reasons
was, he thought, that the Govern-
ment of States was rather remote,
and the interests of the colored
people would perhaps be better
looked after through dealing with
an individual. That was one of
the reasons in favour of the High
Commissioner. That was one of
the reasons which led to that was
an argument in favour of having
control in localizing on the spot
and getting into closer con-
tact.

Lord Stanley agreed there was
considerable advantage in having
a person rather than an abstract
body. Sir Hilton said it was in-
doubtedly of very special impor-
tance to the primitive people, but
as to natives, he thought it was
always important for the govern-
ment to feel that they were not too far
separated from the Government. That
was the most important was the
effect on the native primitive
mind, who could not understand
any other form than the personal
word of the governing individual.
It was for that reason, he thought,
that any form of combination
of those territories one had to be
very careful to keep perfectly fixed
in the native mind who was the
actual Government was. If they

pointed out, a High Commissioner
would not be very ready to step
into the foreground.

Referring to Lord Stanley, who

KENYA'S AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION.

Record Crops of Maise and Coffee.

WHEAT BELOW ESTIMATE.

Departmental Report for Month of January.

The monthly crop report for January issued by the Department of Agriculture, states that a slight reduction is shown on the potatoes estimate for February, but this does not affect the steady yield of 8.4 bags per acre. The total yield is given at 1,781,800 bushels from 212,230 acres under cultivation.

As it is an increase over the coffee estimate, and 19,000 tons is now expected this season, it is realized it will constitute a record yield for the Colony.

What has declined considerably, the yield per acre not having been realized, is in manganese but has been due to disease. The revised estimated yield is now 74,900 acres and 399,050 bags.

Export Forecasts.

The following crop report for the month of January has been issued by the Department of Agriculture. The total yield is given at 1,781,800 bushels from 212,230 acres under cultivation.

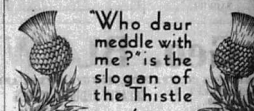

EAST AFRICAN CLOSER UNION PROBLEMS.

Further Views of Sir E. Hilton Young.

OPPOSED TO COMMON ROLL

Advisory Committees of the Three Legislatures Unworkable.

During the course of further evidence before the Joint Parliamentary Committee (the first portion of which was published yesterday) Sir E. Hilton Young said it was not desirable that natives should concern themselves with central legislation as they were not yet capable of taking an effective part. They should be given an opportunity of political development under their own traditional leaders in their own areas.

Referring again to the advantages of the co-ordination of services, he said that the present control of medical service did not lead to efficiency. The only way to secure the maximum efficiency was unified control. The medical service was not the only case—there was also the question of animal as well as human diseases.

He favoured Mombasa as the headquarters of the High Commissioner, although the latter would, of course, be frequently travelling about the territories.

He was opposed to the common voters roll, on the ground that there was no practical relationship between the three races that could be foreseen within a reasonable period.

In regard to the suggestion that there should be Advisory Committees appointed by the three Legislatures, instead of an Advisory Council, Sir E. Hilton Young expressed the opinion that these would not function as efficiently as described. He described them as an "arch without the keystone."

Headquarters at Mombasa.

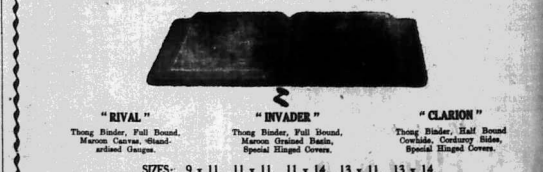
