FRENCH REPLY TO THE AMERICAN PROPOSALS.

Unconditional Payments by Germany Must Be Made.

ALTERNATIVE OFFER OF HELP.

Probability of Compromise in the Coming Discussions.

Approval of Mr. Hoover's proposals regarding the moratorium for one year for war debt payments, is recorded from many countries.

France, in agreeing to America's proposals, declares that the general suspension of payments seems insufficient remedy for the dangers at present threatening Europe and therefore states that the French Government is prepared to lodge with the Bank of International Settlements, funds equivalent to its share of the net defensible annuity. This will be used for the improvement of credit in Germany and the Central European countries.

A statement issued by America indicates willingness to arrive at a compromise with France although it is considered that discussion of the proposals is needed.

Canada and New Zealand have both accepted Mr. Hoover's proposals, whilst South Africa, while agreeing, states that she will not avail herself of Mr. Snowden's offer to extend the moratorium to inter-Empire debts.

British Empire Accepts.

Representatives in London of Poland, Rumania, Czechoslovakia, Latvia, and Estonia are to-day being officially informed of the details of the defensible annuity plan of the Chamberlain of the House of Commons on the British Empire. As soon as the Hoover proposals are generally accepted, the British Government in the United Kingdom will be prepared to suspend for one year the normal payments due to other countries in respect of war debts and other claims on this country—British Official Wireless Service.

India's Finance.

The Indian Government's acceptance of Mr. Snowden's defensible annuity plan is contained in an official statement which indicates that the budget saving thereby will be £25,000,000 from repayments. £25,000,000 from repayments.

South Africa.

Prime Minister, Mr. H. Verwoerd, has accepted Mr. Hoover's proposal and has announced that the Government's financial operations is concerned, but has declined to avail himself of Mr. Snowden's offer to extend the moratorium to inter-Empire debts.

France's Proposals.

The French reply to Mr. Hoover's proposal was made in the Chamber by the Premier, M. Laval, expressing willingness to accept a period of a year from repaying war debts, but with the understanding that the normal interest of the first four years would be suspended. The French Government has approved of the Government's proposal to Mr. Hoover's proposal for 300 million francs.

Debate in Chamber.

The debate in the French Chamber on the Hoover proposals lasted till 10.30 this morning, when a motion approving the French Government's proposal was adopted by the Government to suspend the normal interest of the first four years of the moratorium payment of the unconditional annuity of the war debts.

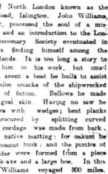

either for Indian or European development, and that you were lacking the proper funds.
