**BRITAIN FACES FINANCIAL CRISIS**

**EMERGENCY MEASURES TO PROTECT GOLD RESERVE.**

**Partial Suspension of the Gold Standard.**

**BANK RATE RAISED TO 6 PER CENT.**

**Determined Attempt to Check the Withdrawals of Foreign Credits.**

**Six Months' Scheme.**

The British Government has adopted severe emergency measures to protect the nation's gold reserve against the heavy withdrawals of foreign balances from London which have recently been credited during the last few days.

Since the middle of July funds amounting to more than £200,000,000 have been sent out from gold and foreign currency and partly by proceeds of large credits granted by France and America.

The method adopted by the Government to meet the situation is a temporary and partial departure from the gold standard by suspending the clause which requires the Bank of England to sell gold at a fixed price. Simultaneously the Bank's discount rate has been raised to 6 per cent.

The gold holding of the Bank amounts to £130,000,000 and it is considered inadvisable to allow the reserve to be reduced further.

There is no interruption of ordinary banking business but purchasers of foreign titles by British citizens will be actively discouraged.

The decision has been received in Britain in an atmosphere of complete calm. American comment expresses admiration of British courage in facing the crisis. American bankers believe that the measures taken should be effective in restoring the stability of the exchange.

**FOREIGN OPINION.**

**Measures Apprehended in London.**

New York, September 20. The partial suspension of the Gold Standard Act by Great Britain has appeared to Wall Street as a constructive measure destined to be abandoned in a few days. It is pointed out that the suspended clause had effect since the Treasury refused to meet the demand of Great Britain by the Federal Reserve Bank and the Morgan Syndicate which are spending millions in gold defence, but will affect the service of the last few days immediately held in the United States. It is expected that British handling will control foreign exchange transactions by means of a limited foreign exchange rate.

While the latest development has created considerable uneasiness in American stock markets, Wall Street analysts are of opinion that the American banking system is sound and that the American banks will hold in London an small amount of gold. The Treasury Department bankers maintain small balances in London for clients and it is estimated that these do not exceed fifty million dollars.

**In Hands of Nation.**

Washington, September 20. Authorities here are of opinion that the future of Great Britain will depend on the hands of private speculation and bankers. The partial suspension of the Gold Standard Act is considered a last resort which should have been taken at an earlier date.

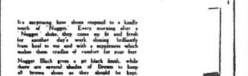

Municipal Office.

"It was a question," the Mayor admitted, as to whether the new Municipality was to be a body of necessity. From the standpoint of the staff they were, together with the fact that the Council were paying something like £1800 a year, to maintain the present office where conditions were such that they could not expect to get the best out of them in the future. It would be better to have the office where it should be, and towards the interest and sinking fund of the new building would be the office should be got on with as soon as possible.

Another important matter was sewage and sewerage disposal. For the last seven or eight years there had been a proposal in certain parts of the commercial area, and no one could doubt that it was an advantage. The engineer was now working on "B" zone, which included Salisbury Road and Ngara Road, and this work should also be gone on with at the earliest possible moment. It was admitted that would help to make the town better, and that the Council might come to some extent on the sewerage there was an act of the emergency budget and charges.

As to town planning, the Mayor described part of the scheme as having been built "highly irregularly" because there had been no proper authority to lay it out in straight lines. Buildings had been put up without by-laws and regulations to govern the building, with the result that they were built in a haphazard way, and the people living in them were not getting the best instructions to have many of them demolished. In other parts of the Municipality houses were built this way and that, without adequate means of access for the emergency cart. Thanks to Government, which had sanctioned the fact that town planning was a necessary matter, these things could be put in order.

An important matter which the Municipality had taken up was the matter of the removal of Paganini statues to a better spot. The Council were to be out of active business for a few days, and the Emergency Committee which had just been appointed would be in a position to consider the matter in the next meeting. The Council were working along the lines of the modern town better, and it was the hope of the public because they did not put it a bit of time, all for the benefit of Nairobi. It had, therefore, outlined what he would endeavor to accomplish during his year of office, and he hoped the people of Nairobi would give their support in presenting forward these necessary requirements. (Applause.)

"KEEP COOL WITH AND STEADY NERVES."

REDUCED PRODUCTION OF MAIZE IN KENYA.

Smaller Acreage Under Cultivation. PLATEAU CHIEFLY AFFECTED.

Yields of Wheat and Coffee Also Show a Decrease.

The monthly report on crops in Kenya for August, issued by the Department of Agriculture, states that the depreciations by locusts have continued to cause losses in some areas, making it increasingly difficult to obtain estimates of yields likely to be obtained.

The area under maize has been reduced by 6,081 acres as compared with last year. The Trans Naku and Plateau are the areas where the decrease has taken place, whereas the Nakuru district shows an increase in acreage.

Owing to further sowings of wheat, chiefly in the Nakuru district, there is a slightly increased acreage over the previous months, but there is still a decrease of 15.5 per cent. as compared with the previous season.

A slight increase in the area under coffee, as compared with the July estimates is indicated, but as a result of adverse weather conditions and ravages of pests and diseases, the crop is expected to be lighter than previously anticipated.

Departmental Report.

The Kenya Department of Agriculture has issued a report for the month of August, which shows that an unusual and serious month in the number of crop reports received. The reports for August have established a more serious acreage than for any other month. The main crops to be further investigated by locusts are wheat and maize. The wheat crop has been estimated to be 100,000 acres, and the maize crop to be 1,000,000 acres.



### CHEVROLET'S RECORD PERFORMANCE

Durban—Johannesburg Race.

The following is an extract from the "Sunday Times" of Johannesburg, of September 5, 1933.  
"The Durban-Johannesburg race was completed on Friday by E. W. Sherwood in his Chevrolet Ford over 11 minutes. This overtook the recently-set Chevrolet Ford record of 11 minutes, set by Sherwood and his companion (J. Veleby) were timed from Durban. Post Office at 8 a.m. arrived at the City Deep at 2.1 p.m. and the Johannesburg arrival at 2.45 p.m. They covered 'Mayville City' Deep stretch in hours 27 minutes, the time recorded by 11 minutes. Last time Sherwood attempted the run he was deterred by the police at Newcastle, and determined to observe all speed limits in municipalities. He was 10 m.p.h. Sherwood stated, 'and this naturally pulled down progress.' At Porters the car was into time and the Motor was 10 m.p.h. after ten minutes, and Marlborough was reached the excellent time of one hour. Thereafter the car methodically and without incident ran to schedule. With seven minutes to go in Durban Sherwood had necessary chances. At Ladyship the Chevrolet was 11 minutes. From this point to Newcastle, states the driver, the worst section of road was encountered over the Blignarburg, the chert road which led him down and to Newcastle his lead on the road had dropped back on the 11 minutes.

Determined to make up his mind, Sherwood set his Chevrolet along on full throttle over the stretch Newcastle-Volkmer stretch, and this resulted in two heavy moments; there being a sharp dip at 85 m.p.h. and travelled 50 feet above the road bed and had a 'hot' but was recovered when he reached the Newcastle stretch. When he had been run into a head wind but to speed back he estimated about 15 m.p.h. Standards was reached with only eight minutes to hand, and in the ensuing 60 miles he had another hour minute. Over the final stretch to Johannesburg, Sherwood took only 11 minutes against the Ford's 12 minutes.

The only stop made was at Standerton, where the car was fueled with Atlantic petrol, which was used throughout the race. The engine was washed with Castrol, and it was not found necessary to replace the same, so well did this oil stand up to the gruelling race. For that matter, was any water added?

The programme of next year's flights, published today, indicates, however, that Mongolia in Tanganyika is the most southerly point in the selected route and that the journey of the R.A.F. in 1922, in previous years to the Union of South Africa, will be discontinued. The expedition, however, will fly to the Cape of Good Hope, including the new air base at Durban, which will be the most important port under taken in the series.



of the variety of flying conditions from sea-level to the higher altitudes. It is particularly gratifying that the itinerary includes the coastal points of Durban, Swaziland, Mozambique and Zanzibar which are now being brought more rapidly, by rail aviation, within the wide area which the modern forms of transportation serve. lowest possible rate that can be levied without a direct loss, but that only when a passenger can conveniently afford to pay the full fare, requiring no special provision as regards equipment and staff and capable of being carried only when other better paying traffic does not require the full fare, and strictly in accordance with the conditions laid down in the 1919-20 Official Traffic Book.

Provided such conditions are adhered to, a set of "direct loss" tickets, if a rate is charged exactly equal to direct haulage cost (i.e. rate above such cost combined with haulage cost referred to above), the deficiency towards such a rate and a rate covering total cost must be made good by other profitable traffic if the total cost to be covered.

In addition, the rates covering direct haulage costs or even working (2 and 3 above) can be charged without actual loss when the traffic concerned is not a peak traffic, i.e. when it can be carried in rolling stock and staff requirements, the extent of the traffic, if follows from the fact that a traffic is capable only of bearing a rate equivalent to direct haulage cost.

In working cost, such a rate can only be applied if the conditions confining such rates are strictly adhered to.

#### Develop High Valued Crops.

The first object of the latter can be improved by a greater development of higher valued crops and it is hoped that agricultural departments and other sets will work to this end.

There is evidence to show that such development has not made the progress anticipated thereby through the Railway Administration open to the public, and it has provided equipment and services of a standard far above what the low wheel traffic actually being carried can afford to pay.

#### Estimating Direct Losses.

In estimating whether there is an actual out-pocket loss on any traffic, several must therefore be had to the type of service rendered, the extent of the traffic, whether it creates a peak demand for the rolling stock, etc. etc. Figures have been quoted in the report for the first three types of one referred to above. Direct haulage cost, however, is difficult to find, but in a memorandum prepared in 1910, based on 1908 figures, it was stated that 2.5 cents would be an approximately correct average figure for this type of cost.

#### Low-Rated Commodities.

Examination of columns 6 of the tables on page 60 of the Annual Report for 1919 shows that there are at least four commodities which are charged rates approximately to direct haulage costs. When it is stated that these commodities together represent 72

per cent of the total public traffic and that one of them at least has increased to such an extent as to be carried in a special train, it is not surprising that a demand for rolling stock and a demand for rolling stock on haulage cost conditions now no longer apply, and that the direct loss made traffic is a proper study high.

#### Examination by Railway Council.

The whole question is now being studied by the Railway Council, in accordance with the terms of the concerned. 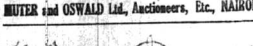
