## Parliament.

### AN IRISH ULTIMATUM.

#### SUBSCRIBING IN B.C.A.

#### SUMNERSON'S SUCCESSOR.

Nov. 20. Mr. Chamberlain announced in the House of Commons that Lord Fitzgibbon had finally decided not to allow the revocation of the charter from British Central Africa to the gold diggers of the Rand.

Nov. 21. The Public Accounts Committee of the House of Commons in their report generally accept the findings of the War Office Commission.

Nov. 21. Replying to a series of questions from Mr. Roland Mr. Haldane explained that the Ordinance of 1904 dealing with Mauritius was issued at the request of the Colony in order to establish a fixed Military contribution and arrange for an increase in garrison to be raised. He added that Mauritius makes by far the smaller contribution in proportion to her Revenue and the cost of garrison than any other Eastern Colony.

## Russia.

## Germany.

### THE KAISER'S POLICY.

#### SOCIALISM GAINING GROUND.

Nov. 16. Prince von Bismarck made an important speech in the Reichstag yesterday. He said that a close rapprochement with France in view of the feeling in that country was unattainable. He declared any intention of forming a wedge between France and Russia of France and England and declared that Germany's relations with Russia were friendly and ended by saying that Germans must keep their sword sharp as so to be useful to friends and unpleasant to enemies.

Nov. 19.—Following the recent speech made in the Reichstag by Prince von Bismarck the German Press are assailing the Kaiser and the Court clique for their influence upon Foreign Policy.

### The Water-Supply

of Mombasa.

The Opinions of Local Medical Authorities.

'Ankylo Stomach' a Common Disease.

Last week we interviewed the medical authorities of Mombasa with a view of obtaining professional opinions as to the value of the present system of water supply on Mombasa Island. As a result of various consultations with these gentlemen we have been able to secure valuable evidence which condemns the present system of water supply unconditionally. In order that the various opinions may be more easily compared, we have divided the subject into sections.

### OPINIONS.

#### Is our Well Water Contaminated?

Dr. W. H. B. Macdonald, Medical Officer of Health for Mombasa: "I am not aware that a quantity of such a fine analysis of our well water, has ever been made. As I am an ardent admirer of the 'Valiant', I am glad to see that you make the necessary tests. I am not prepared to say that your water is good, but I am of the opinion that our well water is very pure, and that it is well surrounded by deposits in close proximity there would not be any objection to its use. I would regard all wells with grave suspicion. Our well water contains lime and sodium salts in considerable quantities, and I am of the opinion that salt is not used by drinking water containing these salts." - Dr. W. H. B. Macdonald, Medical Officer of Health for Mombasa.

#### Is a new Water supply urgently needed?

Dr. Macdonald says: "It is highly desirable from a health point of view that fresh water from inland should be brought to Mombasa. It is not likely that the 'Valiant' is good, or, in my opinion, is there sufficient quantity to take the place of our present water supply. I have never seen better water in East Africa than the water of Tavo. This water is derived from springs close to Kitimatira."  
Dr. Lays: "It is essential that new supply of water should be abundant. Drains without plenty of water are frequently apt to be caused by drinking water containing these salts." - Dr. W. H. B. Macdonald, Medical Officer of Health for Mombasa.

East Africa To-day.

The reports in this issue of the speeches made at the banquet held in Mombasa and Nairobi on St. Andrew's night make an interesting reading as any matter which has ever been published in this Journal, His Excellency, the Governor spoke more freely and more optimistically on Friday night than on any previous occasion since he took over the reins of Government. It is to be regretted that His Excellency could not have been present on this occasion respecting our revenue they had not yet been submitted to the Home Government, but he told us that the progress has been very satisfactory, which in itself must cause us considerable gratification and we believe when these figures become known, our estimate for 1910, which we published in a recent issue will no longer be regarded as fanciful but as much below the possible mark.

On the subject of the great labour question we have the statement of the President of the East Africa Protectorates Society, one possibility in a better position to judge than any other non-official in this country. He says that labour supply, derived from adequate to what we hope will presently be required—and that there is no reason to be apprehensive by pointing out that the Government Railway authorities have found it necessary to import largely unskilled labour and common labour to carry out railway contracts. On the other hand, His Excellency has discovered new sources of labour supply which he hopes will suffice to meet our demands for some time to come in the highland districts, though he very much doubts whether this supply will be available for such districts as those which include the areas surrounding the Victoria Falls, and therefore we cannot overmuch we would, that our labour supply is limited in adequate taken as a whole, and if we would make real progress this matter must have the most earnest attention of the Government.

The decision of His Excellency to make his headquarters at Nairobi and to remove the Treasury and Government offices to Nairobi will no doubt give the most satisfaction in our highland country.

The almost naive way in which His Excellency states that he is going home to ask His Majesty's Government to start a railway approach in every way. We cannot demand that the people of the United Kingdom should make further sacrifices for our benefit but we can demand that they should help us along during our present stage and we, on our part, can only give our preliminary offer of one started with a fair start we will soon receive the British taxpayer from further taxation in regard to this country, and we can only hope for a quick return of all those monies which they have expended in what to make us what we are to-day.
