HOME.

Imperial Parliament.

Important session, in the House of Commons on Tuesday, Mr. Churchill announced that it had been decided to substitute this year a list of mobilization of the third fleet, instead of the usual grand manoeuvre.

At question-time, Col. Bely informed Mr. Woodford that sum of £140,000 yearly would be saved if the South African garrison was quartered in Great Britain, however, additional barracks would be necessary, that saving would be materially reduced.

The Supplementary Naval Estimates, amounting to £2,000,000, have been introduced into the Commons.

Home Rule Protest.

Mr. Ballou stood on Wednesday evening at a House held at the Grosvenor Club. In his speech he denounced the Bill, which he said, he was a believer in, but because Ulster was in the right line of the Government's policy, he would not support it. He might modify the Government. He severely reproached the Government for its policy of half-measures, and suggested such as "Home Rule" which Home Rule was his chief aim. He said that the Bill would be the worst of all that had been proposed in his eyes, but if the Government wanted to avoid civil war he would support a Bill which would give the members of the Government rejected their own right to a referendum. He would not vote without a plebiscite and without Home Rule.

LUMBWA.
