### Statement by Sir E. Grey.

Last week closed with Europe in a state of extreme disquiet and uncertainty. As the cable news began to filter through on Sunday and Monday it became evident that Germany had kindled the blaze by invading Russian and French territory.

#### PREMIER'S FINE APPEAL

##### HOME RULE POSTPONED.

(THROUGH BETTIE'S AGENCY.)

London, Thursday.

A message from Malta states that a precautionary stage of mobilization has been ordered. The dockyard is most active, work continuing throughout the night. All leave has been cancelled.

Mobilization is proceeding in fifty-two out of the seventy-eight governments of Russia. The Emperor Francis Joseph and Prince Charles are returning to Vienna.

It is reported at St. Petersburg that an artillery battle has begun near Smolensko, to the south of Belgrade.

An urgent conference has been held at St. Edward Grey's residence between party leaders, with the object of endeavouring to bring about an Irish settlement.

Speaking in the House of Commons, Sir Edward Grey said he regretted that the situation was not less grave than it was yesterday. Austria had begun war against Serbia, while Russia had partially mobilized. Hitherto, there had been no corresponding steps taken by the other Powers. Great Britain continued to strive for the peace of Europe. He was glad to say that, up to now, he had no difficulty in keeping in touch with the other Powers, though it had not been possible for them to join in the diplomatic action he proposed on Monday.

#### BRITAIN UNITED.

The second reading of the Amending Bill has been postponed. Mr. Asquith explained the reason for this step, in the House, said: "We meet today under conditions unparalleled in the experience of any one of us. The issues of peace and war are hanging in the balance, with the risk of a catastrophe of which it is impossible to measure the dimensions and effects. Consequently it is vital to the whole world that a momentary pause be made in the progress of the Amending Bill, we would inevitably involve acute controversies concerning domestic differences. Such use of our time at such a moment may have injurious, and lastingly injurious, effects on the international situation. Mr. Bonar Law shares fully my views. We, therefore, propose to postpone the Amending Bill, without prejudice to its

future, hoping that the patriotism of all parties will contribute towards doing what lies in our power, if not to avert, at least to circumvent the calamities threatening the whole world."

There was not a moment of dissent as Mr. Asquith finished his statement. The Irishmen appeared to support the Government as heartily as the Conservatives.

Precautionary military naval measures, including the protection of docks, etc., continue to be taken in the United Kingdom, and the Dominions. Aircraft-guns have been mounted in the neighbourhood of all tanks. Nearly the whole of the Mediterranean Fleet is now concentrated at Malta.

It is reported, from diplomatic circles in Berlin, that Germany has asked Russia for an explanation as to her mobilization, and requested a reply as speedily as possible. The Labour Members in the House of Commons have passed a resolution expressing confidence in Sir Edward Grey.

According to Serbian official advice, the Austrians are bombarding Belgrade.

Lights in the Gulf of Finland are extinguished at night, and navigation is prohibited.

Reuter states that, at 11 o'clock last evening, the view of diplomats was that the situation is still grave, despite the powerful influences working for peace. News of fresh military movements was giving rise to serious concern.

#### BELGRADE IN FLAMES.

It is officially stated in Vienna that Belgrade is in flames. A despatch says, consequent upon the renewal of machine-gun fire in Belgrade at midnight, the Austrian monitors replied, bombarding the city. A magazine exploded at one o'clock in the morning. The Serbians, at dawn, unsuccessfully tried to destroy the bridge. The Austrian artillery demolished the customs house in reply to shots fired from the building. At the same time, fire broke out at different points in Belgrade.

It is rumored that serious disturbances have broken out in New Serbia, in consequence of the refusal of non-Serbian elements to enter the army.

It is stated from St. Petersburg that the sailing of the British Fleet from Portland has created an immense impression, and this, coupled with Japan's assurances has confirmed Russia's determination to stand to her guns.

#### ATTACK ON BELGRADE.

London, Friday. The Admiralty have notified Welsh coal

owners that the entire output may be required for naval purposes.

A message from Belgrade, dated July 30, states that the Austrians, at 11 o'clock yesterday evening, began a second attack on Belgrade. A heavy rainstorm was maintained by monitors till 2 o'clock in the morning, and some buildings were damaged. The Serbian guns seldom replied, though an Austrian bombardment was severely damaged.

An attempt by the assailants to cross the river was repulsed by rifles and machine-guns. Rifle fire continued till 4 o'clock in the morning. There were no Serbian losses. A renewal of the attack was expected at noon. Attempts by the Austrians to cross the rivers Save and Danube were everywhere repulsed.

A despatch, which is apparently anterior to the official communication received at Vienna on July 31, concludes: "It is reported that the Austrians intend to bombard Belgrade."

#### COLONIES' OFFER OF HELP.

##### ITALY'S ATTITUDE.

London, Friday.

The Bank of Germany discount rate is 5 per cent. and Belgium have issued orders forbidding the export of all foodstuffs and materials likely to be useful in the event of war.

The "Impregator" is not sailing for America owing to the situation.

Reuter states that conversations have been resumed between Vienna and St. Petersburg.

A Berlin message states that the Kaiser has proclaimed martial law. It is reported from the Hague that Queen Wilhelmina has ordered an urgent general mobilization.

Speaking in Parliament, the Premier of New Zealand said if the occasion arose New Zealand would offer an expeditionary force.

In the Imperial Parliament Mr. Asquith announced that Canada had also offered assistance. He exclaimed, "Well done, Canada." The Leader of the Opposition heartily concurred. All rose and sang the National Anthem.

Before the adjournment of the House, the Premier said he had just heard through Germany that Russia had proclaimed a general mobilization of the army and fleet, in consequence of which martial law had been proclaimed in Germany. Mobiliza-

tion would follow if the Russian mobilization was general and was proceeded with. It is officially stated in Berlin that the Russians have destroyed a railway bridge in Austria between Szebenowa and Gratzka.

It is expected that the Bank Act will be suspended.

Italy's attitude has hitherto been uncertain. It may be a most important factor at the eleventh hour. The "Tribuna" says the cabinet has come to no decision regarding military measures.

#### MONEY AND STOCKS.

With the closing of the New York Stock Exchange to-day the world's stock markets are at a standstill. Other markets are disappointed. Foodstuffs, etc., are continually becoming dearer. Sugar is 63 higher per ton.

It is official stated that as a result of an interview between Mr. Lloyd George, Mr. Asquith and London bankers, it was decided that the present financial position does not justify any emergency action, but in the event of further developments the Treasury will be prepared to take such action immediately.

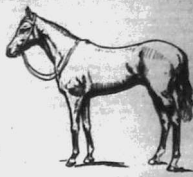

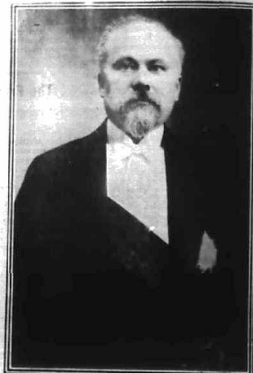

## "Standard" Notes.

Marital law has been proclaimed throughout the Protectorate in its modified form, in that various civil courts retain their powers.

The meeting of settlers which was to take place at Government House on Wednesday afternoon to discuss the Labour question was postponed.

Within two to three hours of a lady passenger landing in Mombasa her gold watch was stolen in one of the hotels.

Lady Kathleen Estance, widow of Colonel E. J. K. Estance, died lately at Wokingham in her seventy-seventh year. She was a daughter of the fourth Earl of Dartmouth.

The steamer "Galba" sailed from Southampton on July 16th, and arrived at Kilindi on August 4th, 4 p.m.

Mr. Stone, of the well-known firm of Stone Bros. of South Africa, is making his second tour of inspection through the country with a view to business.

The "Llandovery Castle" which sailed from Kilindi on July 18th, arrived at Mombasa on July 21st, and proceeded homeward on the same day.

The Indians concerned in the Uganda Railway strike have passed a resolution agreeing to refrain from any action so long as England is engaged in war.

In view of the great crisis in which the Empire is involved there will be a special service of intercession at St. Stephen's Church from 5.30 to 6.20, every week-day, from Friday onward until further notice.

Mr. Black, the well-known local sportsman, joined the polo-club at Kilindi to accompany Col. and Mrs. Pakenham to Bahr to obtain in N. Rhodesia some specimens to complete his sporting collection.

The first evidence of England being involved in the European war was the fact that on Wednesday morning the German subjects resident in the Protectorate were taken in charge by the police.

Col. Pakenham, the noted American hunter, is reported to have one of the finest collections of African trophies, bearing among others secured last year the blue-necked buffalo and a round elephant; the buffalo horns he secured measured 211 inches.

The "Llandovery Castle" and "Galba" are maintaining their normal service with the probable exception that the former may turn here and proceed home by the Cape, Panama and Congo, accepted without restriction.

When the up-sailed, leaving Mombasa on Sunday morning, was within a mile of Minton station, an employee of the F.W.O. jumped off the train. He was seen to have a somewhat serious fall, but was not seen as still lying motionless.

### Diseases of Stock.

#### GOVERNMENT PATHOLOGIST'S CIRCULAR.

As a view of the importance to stock-owners of the diseases dealt with in the following circular, issued by Mr. E. M. Macdonald, Government Veterinary Pathologist, we have placed in the hands of our subscribers a special form, containing questions which will be filled up and returned, if you send an application to the Veterinary Pathologist, P.O. Nairobi.

**CONTAINER (ERUPTIVE) ABSTRACT.**  
It has recently been shown that this disease does occur in East Africa on the coast. We have at the present time proof of this in the case of the Natives of the Mombasa district. There is an epidemic of this disease in the Native Reserve, near Mombasa, which has been spreading to other parts of the country or from where it was introduced. **Positive diagnosis of this disease can only be effected by a delicate test conducted at the laboratory.** This test involves the serum of certain specific antibodies which are revealed when this serum is mixed with the emulsion of the causal bacteria, the bacillus abortus. This specific substance is present only in cattle which are infected, that is, in animals which have aborted or are about to abort, or as in the case of males, which are carrying infection in their spermatia.

The bacillus abortus attacks the uterus and the foetal envelopes, causing the abortion and the premature expulsion of the young calf. The bacillus is passed out with the dead and subsequent to delivery, each animal passes the bacteria, buildings, etc. on which they feed.

Infection may gain entrance to a cow in several ways, such as by contact with the foetal fluid, or directly through the genital passages. The bull is also held to be a carrier.

It is thought that this disease usually enters the animal by the vagina, or through the vulva, and it is in this way that it may be transmitted without delay, the virus being able to withstand for their resistance.

Efforts will be made to supply the necessary test animals to the various parts of the country having control of the disease, and to supply the necessary test animals to the various parts of the country having control of the disease.

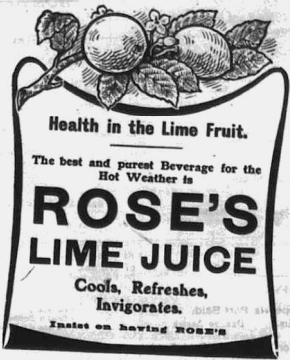

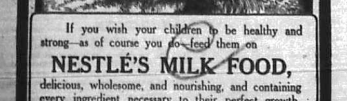

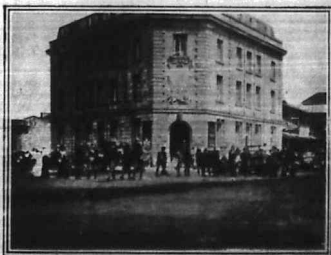
