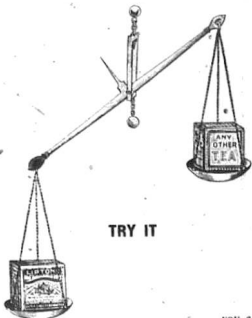

RUSSIAN FRONT MODIFIED.

Huge Concentration of German Forces.

FREZYNIUS HELMED IN.

London, Dec. 19. An official message from Petrograd says that there is a concentration of German forces on the whole front except on the left bank of the Vistula. The concentration is the result of a series of attacks on the enemy's attacks of the last few days have been repulsed with great ease.

We were obliged to modify the disposition of our forces in conformity with the movement of part of our troops towards the river Dnieper and constant pressure of the Austrians in the Carpathians. 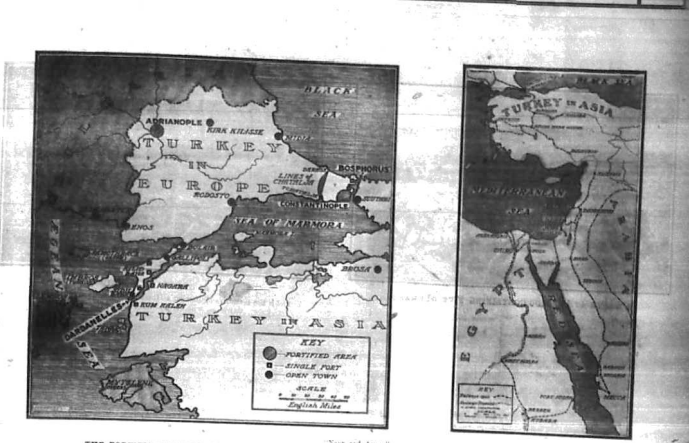

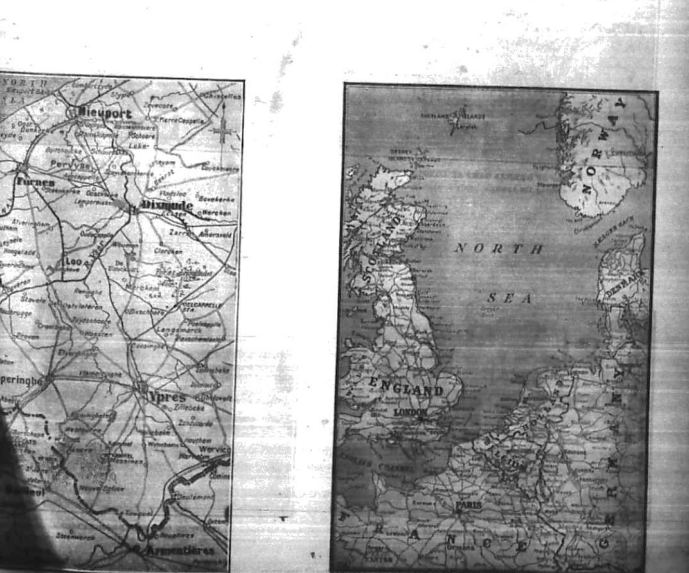
