MRS. HARCOURT'S SUPPORT.

(From Our Own Correspondent.)

London, November 20th. There is now more hope than ever that the Christmas gifts for the East African troops will be able to reach the front in the field before the beginning of the year. This is not altogether our fault. The East African Finance Committee Office Fund was started a little late, but had the funds been given with their usual regularity our commensurate work would have been done by this time. It is not our fault that we have not taken advantage of the best means we could take even though some somewhat liberally in their operations. We hope, however, to get our main contributions away in the first week of December.

It will be recalled that the Committee originally asked for £1,000. We shall not get that sum all right. As a matter of fact, we have secured about £200, in addition to a great many gifts in kind, and in respect of the latter we are endeavouring to purchase on articles which we understand would be of special use to you, such as tea, chocolate—medically prepared—soap, shaving and sanitary toilet, rubber and other articles. There will be placed the majority of the actual orders, though we have already purchased very large quantities of soap.

When we started the organization of the fund we have come to the conclusion that it would be a great mistake solely to regard us as intended to supply Christmas presents, and after carrying on this part of our work we propose to keep in operation the office and of the campaign and report ourselves as a group of body on which you may make no question for commodities which do not strictly come within the list and scope of the requirements which are supplied and which should be supplied by the Government. 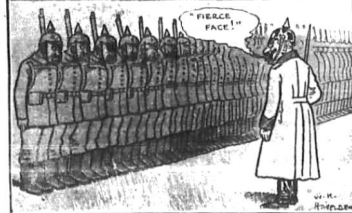
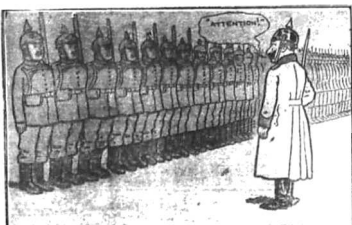

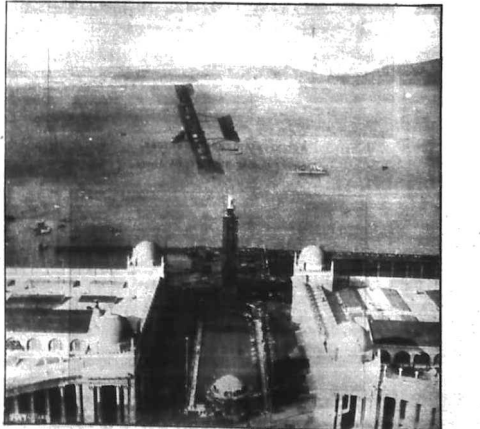
