PAINLESS DENTISTRY.

NEW ANESTHETIC.

LONDON, April 3.

A visit to a dentist's surgery will not in future be such a dread ordeal as at present, if the promise of its early use.

It is stated to be far more satisfactory than cocaine, for apparently there are no ill-effects after its administration, and practically no shock. It is injected from a metal syringe just above or below the troublesome tooth, and in a moment or so there is a curious blanketing of the gum, which assumes a sort of cherry consistency. The operation is then performed with very little discomfort to the patient.

Dentists who have experimented with this anesthetic have found that cases in which pain is felt during the extraction of teeth are remarkably few. It is recorded that a medical man called on a dentist and wanted a small tooth taken out. Novocaine was injected, but even then the dentist had a difficult task. He apologized for the twinges he was convinced he had caused, but the doctor declared he had suffered no pain at all.

Novocaine was only brought into this country in June 1906, so that experiments up till now have not been very general.

## HUNT FOR BRIGANDS.

### SPANISH GOVERNORS ORDERED TO SHOOT THEM AT SIGHT.

MADRID, March 18.

The Governors in Andalucia have received orders from the Ministry that bandits are to be shot down at sight.

Brigandage has developed to such an alarming extent in the provinces that instructions have been issued to organize battions to hunt them down.

One of the first successes was scored by gendarmes, who started out yesterday to capture Aguilar Muelers, who had terrorized the province of Malaga. This brigand had assassinated and robbed many victims, and a year ago was captured and condemned to death. But he escaped from prison in September last, since when he has renewed his crimes with redoubled energy.

Seventeen gendarmes located him yesterday in the Sierra Chisheilla Mountains, near Alora, and surrounded him. They called on him to surrender, but his reply was to discharge a blunderbuss charged with buckshot among his pursuers. Four gendarmes were so seriously wounded that their lives are despaired of.

Several gendarmes then took aim and fired at the brigand, his body being riddled with bullets. The body was carried on a donkey to Alora, where it was exposed in a public place.

### PRINCE ALBERT AND SPORT.

LONDON, April 5.

One of the most interested spectators of the curling competitions of the English province of the Royal Canadian Club at Prince Albert, Skating Rink yesterday afternoon was Prince Albert of Wales.

His Royal Highness was escorted to the rink by Mr. W. G. Grace, with whom he has been playing golf early in the day. The doctor, who has no greater admirer in the country than Prince Albert, was taking part in the competition as leader for the London Curling Club, and was called upon by the Prince to explain fully the intricacies of the Scottish national game.

The Prince and Dr. Grace lined up together in the evening, after which the famous cricketer escorted his charge to Marlborough House.

### NIGERIA'S PROSPERITY.

#### VALUE OF AMALGAMATION.

LONDON, MARCH 28.

Sir Percy Girouard, Sir Frederick Lugard's successor in the High Commissioner's office of Northern Nigeria, arrived at Lagos on Tuesday with railway equipment, and left for rail-head now nearly at Oshogbo, about 150 miles from Lagos, telegraphing our correspondent. It is almost certain that the railway gauge will be made 5ft. 6in. throughout, and that the line will cross the Niger south of Jebba and run thence straight to Zungeru, in Northern Nigeria.

Great prosperity has followed the amalgamation a year ago of Lagos and Southern Nigeria. The revenue is far in excess of the estimates.

Engineers arrive next month to begin the new harbour works, which will allow of the accommodation of the largest liners and will cost £3,000,000.

### DISSOLUTION POSSIBLE.

#### THE DUMA'S FERRIL.

ST. PETERSBURG, April 1.

After the meeting of the Council of Ministers at the Winter Palace on Saturday night, orders were sent to the St. Petersburg Prefect of Police, M. Draskovskii, bidding him communicate at once with the military authorities with regard to the necessary measures for coping at a moment's notice with any emergency which might arise in the event of a sudden dissolution of the Duma.

I learn on excellent authority that the opinion prevalent at the Council was that collaboration with the present Duma was impossible, particularly in regard to the agrarian question. The Minister for Agriculture in the Duma to-day pro-temperarily maintained the principle of the absolute inalienability of private property.

Reports from the Governors of all provinces indicate a new impetus to the revolutionary movement, partly due to excited speeches by the Duma. The Governors propose a strict censorship of reports of the debates in the local Press.

It seems evident that the Government has decided to defy or so dissolve the Duma. Which alternative it adopted depends upon the Duma's attitude in the immediate future.

### COOK AS TYPHOID GERM.

NEW YORK, April 2.

Harlem and, to all appearances, healthy Mary Diveron is under the detention of the Health Department here on suspicion of infecting during the last six years twenty-five members of various families with whom she has been cook.

She had typhoid fever in 1901, and apparently recovered, but Commissioner Darlington and several physicians have satisfied themselves that she is really a living typhoid germ—a factory turning bacilli out by the million.

### STENOPHILE SOUND MACHINE.

KENIL, April 3.

American Consul J. J. Britain writes from Kenil that, according to the *Journal of Allocations*, the Stenophile device, recently invented by Charles Hyatt, Chevalier of the Legion of Honor and director of the *Bulletin of the Halls*, has given some very practical and interesting results. The machine reproduces sounds automatically, by syllables, in typographic characters. It is operated in the same way as the typewriter; has a keyboard, which consists of twenty keys. Each key, upon being pressed, points the corresponding letter on a band of paper, which swirls itself on a sort of pulley. The characters are the same as those of the usual alphabet. It is easy to read at first sight what the machine has written. It is simple

strong, and light, and exacts in its management neither effort nor rigid attention. A child or blind man can easily learn to use it. It writes very swiftly, writing as high as 200 words per minute, without fatiguing the operator or annoying the reader by noise. It can be used for all languages. The machine was recently exhibited in the office of the *Journal of Allocations*, in Strasbourg, where it gave excellent results, reproducing both French and German with perfect facility. It is already in use in many schools.

SIR GODFREY LANGDEN.

### THE NATIVE QUESTION.

CAPE TOWN, April 1.

Treating of the wages question, Sir Godfrey reports: "Native as a rule set themselves the task of acquiring certain amount of money to gratify certain wants, and having acquired it retire and rest. Were they to gain very high wages they would retire to rest at an earlier period, and thus spend a greater time in repose." Sir Godfrey does not consider that the native population is desirous of its to come under the European law. It is in his opinion sufficient for the practice of native law and customs to be allowed without defining what it precisely is. There are many reasons why the customs differ. Sir Godfrey Langden approves the project of a native council. "I think," he says, "that the Government should consider of forming a council entirely of natives who should be selected for their influence or ability, and should be summoned to meet annually under the presidency of an officer of the native affairs department. The functions of such a council should be purely consultative—i.e., it should be permitted after the conference to make representations for communication to the Government as regards its feelings in respect of existing laws, or laws requiring amendment, and any matters which have a bearing upon native welfare. That will, I believe, be the best outlet, and in that way the Legislative of the country may reach the mental condition of the natives."

### CARDINAL'S DEATH LEGEND.

CONTINUED COINCIDENCES.

ROME, March 29.

Cardinal Count Louis Maccioli, first Cardinal Deacon, has died suddenly of pneumonia after receiving the Pope's blessing. He had said mass only a few hours before. The death, says Luffan, is regarded as a proof of legend that he would die in three and within three months. Cardinal Cavagasi and Cardinal Trippi died three months ago yesterday.

### NEW MOUNTAIN RAILWAY.

GENOA, March 23.

Money has been subscribed and work will shortly begin to run a railway from Zermatt to the top of the Matterhorn, 14,700 feet high. Swiss engineers, E. Favre and G. Gollie estimate that the work will cost £100,000, and will take four years to accomplish. The cog-wheel system will be employed for the first 7000 feet. The Zermatt Station, across the Zmutt valley, the Zmutthaus, Lac Noir (8100 feet), and under the Hermit to the Alpin Club's hut at a height of 10,000 feet. There will also be almost perpendicular tunnel drilled to the top of the mountain. It will be 7770 feet long, with a gradient of 85 per cent. A station, twenty yards from the summit will be cut out of the solid rock, as well as numerous rooms looking outwards on the magnificent scenery. The cog-wheel system will be compressed oxygen will be built for tourists who suffer from mountain sickness. The railway journey from Zermatt to the summit will cost £2, while at present £5 is the usual fee for guide and porter. The ascent by rail will take an hour and a half and it takes twenty-four to twenty hours to ascend and back on foot. Forty years ago the Matterhorn was climbed for the first time on foot.

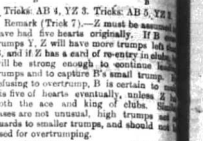
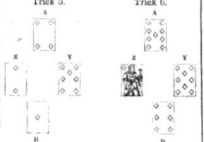
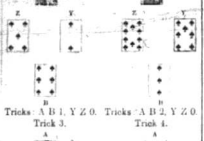

Imperial Constitutional Unity. "The whole difficulty of arriving at a satisfactory solution, whether of the topic of Imperial preference, of Imperial defence, or of Imperial constitutional unity, lies in the mutual ignorance. It is, no doubt, the duty of politicians to inform themselves about the Empire. But politicians are busy with little time to learn anything that they have not learned already before taking to politics. Moreover, the knowledge or ignorance of the politician is only a reflection of the state of mind of his constituents. Effective Imperial unity between democratic communities can only be based on general diffused knowledge of the Empire among all classes. To diffuse that knowledge is one of the first duties of a national educational system whose object it is to make good citizens as well as good men of business. . . . It is nothing short of a disgrace that there is no general map of the Empire issued by our authorities, no proper text-book from which our children should learn the geography of the great heritage which is theirs." - "Times."

Pan-Germanism in a British Colony.

The following is a translation of a remarkable letter recently received by the teacher of a Colonial school from the Imperial German Consulate General for British South Africa. It is captioned, December 17, 1906, - "I give you particular pleasure to be able to forward you special notice from the fund placed at the disposal of the General Consulate by the Imperial Chancellor. From this you may gather that your school is highly appreciated and recognized at home in the Fatherland. Further, it is hoped that the appreciative interest of the Government in your efforts may in turn be an incentive to further faithful and strenuous labour to uphold Germanism in your district. I pray for your acknowledgement of receipt through the Rev. Mr. . . . to Consulate-General, the Imperial Consul-General." The world in the original, which is here translated Germanism, is *Deutschthum*. One wonders, adds the *Open Times*, what the Imperial Chancellor would say if Downing-street took to subsidizing schools in German East Africa or in South-West Africa whether attended by pupils of British origin or not, for their "faithful and strenuous labours" in upholding "British Imperialism" in those "provincial" parts. (Cape Times).

UGANDA. A GREAT BARAZA. A Warning to the Chiefs. AGRICULTURE A WORK OF THE FUTURE. An Important Address. His Excellency the Acting Commissioner, Mr. George Wilson, C.B., accompanied by Mrs. Wilson, called a visit to Kampala on the 10th of April last. The visit was of an official character and on the day following a public 'Baraza' was held in the spacious Coronation Hall. The Baraza was attended by a large attendance. The European community was composed of Officials, the Right Rev. Bishop Tucker and representatives from the several Missionary bodies and the mercantile community. That so many were present, was evidence of the general interest taken in the Administration of the natives. His Highness the Kabaka was also present, together with the Prime Minister, Regents, County Chiefs, and members of Sub-Chiefs and their attendants. The Acting Commissioner first addressed the Europeans and mentioned how that on the recent visit of H. M. Commissioner, Mr. H. H. Bell, C.B., the Chiefs were urged above all other objects, to continue their praiseworthy efforts for the suppression of that dire disease-slaying sickness, and how that they were well and deservedly thanked for what they had already done in that work. Then they were to devote themselves strenuously to the interests of Agriculture, it being evident from all available knowledge, that Uganda must base its career of prosperity upon successful agriculture. Mr. Wilson very firmly intimated that it was the express object of his visit, to drive home to the minds of the chiefs, the fact, that although Commissioner Bell was absent upon his tour of inspection, his projects were carried on. He further intimated, that such subjects of momentous importance as Land Tenure were under consideration. The question of such vital importance of another character - the amelioration of those gross conditions of life, which produce the excessive rate of infantile mortality and disease so lamentably affecting the growth of a healthy population. A great tribute was paid to the Missions, when His Excellency recognised how that the H. M. Government was relieved of the great burden of the education of the people by the Missions, and that when their present remarkable successes were augmented by more advanced technical and industrial schools, he considered the results would be phenomenal in the world's history on the education of the natives. In the conclusion of his address to the European community, His Excellency remarked, that while the general enlightenment of the people was an accomplished fact, it remained the work of all bodies having real interest in the country, to keep the people up to the standard of working material, and this was his promise of a large industry. In speaking of coffee, Mr. Dawe intimated that the Commissioner was prepared to sanction the purchase of a few coffee-pulpers for the use of the natives in such districts where coffee was most produced. Cocon were mentioned as being a likely product for our labourers, and how that this would be most truly achieved by an encouragement of the habit of industry, in conjunction with the mighty work already progressing in moral and intellectual education. In addressing the Chiefs on the question of Lands, His Excellency informed them how that the Gov-

ernment had worked hard to get them full use of their lands, without having to wait for the delays of accurate surveys and how that a solution of the problem was being arrived at. They were warned, however, against hastily and foolishly disposing of their lands, as they would later on have cause to regret and become discontented. They were moreover reminded, and wisely so, that they should make the best use of their lands, and that in time many days would be found that there is no room for useless and idle people on useful lands. In the conclusion of the address, the greater question of labour was presented, and His Excellency urged them to greater efforts to manly play their part in the industries that were rapidly developing, warning them that if they failed to do so, others would step in and take their places, as had happened in many other countries. Following the address, His Highness the Kabaka was presented with a state chair, gilded and of solid oak, that had been given by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Kabaka was presented with two other state chairs. At the close His Excellency cordially thanked the Europeans present for the sympathy they had shown in the natives by their attendance.

ADDRESS TO THE CHIEFS ON AGRICULTURE. Leaflets in Baganda. On Saturday, the 20th of April, the Officer-in-Charge of the Botanical and Agricultural Departments, Mr. M. T. Dawe, F.R.S., gave an address to the Chiefs on the agricultural affairs of Uganda. Sir Apollo Kagwa, K.C.M.G., the Katikoro, was present together with the Regents, Chiefs and attendants, altogether numbering about 100 persons. Mr. Dawe first outlined the work of his department and then proceeded to give in simple language some ideas of the present state of the agricultural work in Uganda. How that it was only 3 years ago when cotton seed was first distributed among the natives for commercial cultivation and to-day the production is increasing rapidly, so much so, that there is now not sufficient machinery in the country to deal with it. A considerable quantity of Para and Castilla rubber had been raised from seed imported and sold to the Chiefs during that year and they were reminded how and with what difficulty and expense the Para was first introduced into Ceylon. The first consignments of more advanced technical and industrial schools, he considered the results would be phenomenal in the world's history on the education of the natives. In the conclusion of his address to the European community, His Excellency remarked, that while the general enlightenment of the people was an accomplished fact, it remained the work of all bodies having real interest in the country, to keep the people up to the standard of working material, and this was his promise of a large industry. In speaking of coffee, Mr. Dawe intimated that the Commissioner was prepared to sanction the purchase of a few coffee-pulpers for the use of the natives in such districts where coffee was most produced. In the conclusion of the address, the greater question of labour was presented, and His Excellency urged them to greater efforts to manly play their part in the industries that were rapidly developing, warning them that if they failed to do so, others would step in and take their places, as had happened in many other countries. Following the address, His Highness the Kabaka was presented with a state chair, gilded and of solid oak, that had been given by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Kabaka was presented with two other state chairs. At the close His Excellency cordially thanked the Europeans present for the sympathy they had shown in the natives by their attendance. ADDRESS TO THE CHIEFS ON AGRICULTURE. Leaflets in Baganda. On Saturday, the 20th of April, the Officer-in-Charge of the Botanical and Agricultural Departments, Mr. M. T. Dawe, F.R.S., gave an address to the Chiefs on the agricultural affairs of Uganda. Sir Apollo Kagwa, K.C.M.G., the Katikoro, was present together with the Regents, Chiefs and attendants, altogether numbering about 100 persons. Mr. Dawe first outlined the work of his department and then proceeded to give in simple language some ideas of the present state of the agricultural work in Uganda. How that it was only 3 years ago when cotton seed was first distributed among the natives for commercial cultivation and to-day the production is increasing rapidly, so much so, that there is now not sufficient machinery in the country to deal with it. A considerable quantity of Para and Castilla rubber had been raised from seed imported and sold to the Chiefs during that year and they were reminded how and with what difficulty and expense the Para was first introduced into Ceylon. The first consignments of more advanced technical and industrial schools, he considered the results would be phenomenal in the world's history on the education of the natives. In the conclusion of his address to the European community, His Excellency remarked, that while the general enlightenment of the people was an accomplished fact, it remained the work of all bodies having real interest in the country, to keep the people up to the standard of working material, and this was his promise of a large industry. In speaking of coffee, Mr. Dawe intimated that the Commissioner was prepared to sanction the purchase of a few coffee-pulpers for the use of the natives in such districts where coffee was most produced. Cocon were mentioned as being a likely product for our labourers, and how that this would be most truly achieved by an encouragement of the habit of industry, in conjunction with the mighty work already progressing in moral and intellectual education. In addressing the Chiefs on the question of Lands, His Excellency informed them how that the Gov-
