World's News by  
Cable.  
Political Situation.  
Federal Solution.  
Garvin's Views in "Observer."

(Boster's Special to "East African Standard")

London

Mr. Garvin, in the "Observer," makes a great length with the political situation in America and O'Connor in his speech, and which has been developed in this paper. He also gives a short history of the Radical party and their platform. He says it is now a question whether the vote of the Radical party will be sufficient to elect a President. If the Unionists have a large majority they will elect the new Lord of Ireland, and if the Radicals have a large majority they will elect Mr. Garvin. London

Barker and Fitzpatrick have given a short article on the Irish Home Rule Question.

His article differs from the forward article in the Socialist party who are desirous of getting a majority in the election. The Radicals have next to no chance of winning. He points out that the Radical party will probably not be able to get a majority in the election, and the Radical party will probably not be able to get a majority in the election.
