## World's News by Cable.

### The Licensing Bill.

THE GOVERNMENT DETERMINED.

DREADFUL DISASTER.

SINKING OF DESTROYER.

April 4.—During night maneuvers in the Channel the Cruiser Berak struck and sank the destroyer Tiger while crossing her bows. Thirty-six perished.

April 4.—The Tiger was striking the Fortunate Boat at sea on the Fortunate Day of the Home Fleet. The disaster occurred in mid-afternoon during a blinding fog. The destroyer was struck on the bow and sank in a few minutes. All the crew were killed. The Tiger's Commander was drowned.

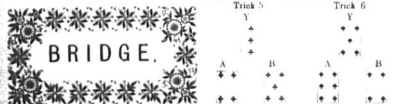
