WORLD'S NEWS BY MAIL.

Exhibition of Tropical Produce.

LIVERPOOL, July 16.

Mr. Chamberlain has volunteered to become an honorary member of the Exhibition of Tropical Produce which is being organized by the Liverpool University Institute of Commercial Research in the Tropics to take place in September. Successful Co-operation.

LONDON, July 23.

By means of co-operation on the Continental principle, Eastern Counties farmers have during the past six months sold pigs to the value of £31,350, and 112,700 eggs in the past four months through a special egg depot. Over 600 farmers representing 184,000 acres are members of this concern, started in March 1904, which in the past half year had a total trade of £24,500.

Another Sinn Fein Recruit

LONDON, July 26.

Sir T. Edmond, Chief Irish Whip, has resigned his seat in the House of Commons. It was reported several days ago that he was about to join the Sinn Fein Society.

Thunderbolt Falls in Front of His Motor-Car.

LONDON, July 23.

Thunderstorms and floods wrought great damage to crops throughout England. Their Majesties were on a drive through Giron-estorville when a thunder-bolt fell in front of the car, plunging up the road and dismounting a tree. The crowd which had gathered at Windsor to await their Majesties scattered in terror on beholding this awe-inspiring sight.

Trained Dogs.

BRUSSELS, July 18.

Twenty-three dogs took part in an international police dog competition at Louvain, the tests including a search for a burglar armed with revolver and stick. The prize-winners, the first five of whom came from Belgium, were all shepherd dogs.

The Ransom of Mr. Abbott.

LONDON, July 15.

Turkey has not yet repaid the £15,000 paid by Britain for the ransom of Mr. Abbott from the brigands at Salonika.

Japan to be Reached from England in 17 Days.

LONDON, July 19.

Japan can now be reached from England in seventeen days. As a result of a new cable (such a London exchange), a train left Charing Cross carrying passengers who will barring accidents, reach the Far East in 7 days less than the journey has ever been accomplished. The passengers reached Moscow on Wednesday last, and are due at Irkutsk, on Lake Baikal, in the very heart of Asia, next Wednesday. On the following Monday they will arrive at Vladivostok, a steamer will land them in Japan twenty-four hours later. The fares from London are only 145 first class and 432 second class. The trains are most luxuriously appointed, containing besides the ordinary compartments, spacious reading and recreation rooms. It is hoped even further to reduce the time occupied in the journey when the Russian Government has laid a double line of rails on the Trans-Siberian track. Formerly the quickest route to Japan was via Canada and Vancouver—a journey of twenty-four days.

A Scotch Ship Canal.

GLASGOW, July 19.

Evidence for a ship canal, practically along the route of the present Firth and Clyde basin canal, and to cost some £2,000,000 was given before the Canal Commission.

"Limerick" Craze.

LONDON, July 19.

So great has been the demand for six-penny postal orders during the past few weeks owing to the "Limerick" craze that the printers have scarcely been able to supply sufficient of this of this value to the Post Office. The method adopted in the competition is to print the first four lines of a "Limerick," leaving the fifth line to be filled in by the reader, who must send a 6d. postal order for each attempt he makes, the money received being the prize to be distributed. Early in June, the "Daily Mail" when the craze may be said to have begun, the demand for six-penny postal orders began to rise. A few days later the problem of supplying them in sufficiently large quantities began to tax the Post Office authorities. Some idea of the enormous increase may be gained from the fact that during June the average daily output was 21,000, as against a daily average of 3,000 during the year 1906. The greatest demand on any one day was on July 10, when 122,000 were despatched to meet the emergency. On the corresponding day last year only 3,200 were required.

Free Methodist's Estates

NEWCASTLE, June 22.

From a report adopted at a sitting of the U. M. F. C. Assembly at Newcastle it appears that one of the first efforts of the new United Church will be the raising of a Thanksgiving Fund of not less than 100,000 guineas. This was one of the recommendations of the Union Committee, and the money is to be devoted to the extension of the mission work, the placing of the Supernatural Fund on a sound basis, the increase of the capital for chapel loans, etc., the further endowment of the theological institutions, and the aid of necessary local preachers. The report of the Twentieth Century Fund was also adopted, it being reported that £100,000 had been received to date. A resolution was passed discouraging the interchange of ministers by the different circuits of the U. M. F. C. The Missionary Committee recommended that the Convention have no association with any industrial company for developing their states in East Africa, but suggested they might continue experimental development on their own. An amendment suggested the leasing of the land, but before objection was immediately taken to this as leading possibly to invasion of the natives and to the institution of slavery. Mr. Hiley, Bradford, thought they should not use missionary subscriptions on the land, but suggested that company work profit could go to missionary work. Mr. Duckworth, who in favour of granting the native the "dignity of labour," objected to any question of divided or per cent, which brought in a title of the King Leopold business. The committee's recommendation to keep clear of commercial enterprise and go on experimenting was eventually carried.

BRITISH EAST AFRICAN SERVICE.

August 9.—The Commission at the Hague is demanding the fulfilment of proposals for allowing the prohibition of 1893 prohibiting the dropping of explosives from balloons. In the High Court for East Africa at Mombasa. The New 'Taxing' Rule to be strictly Enforced. VALERIE DUNN vs. Plaintiff. Judge Hamilton issued the following judgment on the 14th inst. This is an application under rule 9 of Rules of Court (Taxation of Costs) No. 2 of 1907... The bill in question amounted in all to Rs. 128.50, of which Rs. 43 represented fees of Court leaving a balance of Rs. 115.50 professional charges... The question for me to decide is the meaning of the words 'total bill of costs' in Rule 9. Mr. Atkinson argues they must bear their true and apparent meaning and the bill, being made up of costs of Court and professional charges total must mean the combination of the two. On the other hand it is pointed out by Mr. Datta that the taxing officer has no discretion with regard to Court fees which he is obliged therefore only apply to the portion of the bill with regard to which he has discretionary powers viz the professional charges.

Questions in Parliament. Our Native Reserves. Mr. C. WATSON (Orkney and Shetland) asked the Under-Secretary for the Colonies... Mr. ANSTON asked the Under-Secretary whether when crossing native reserves in British East Africa, he would consider the possibility of placing them in the hands of trustees with a view to preventing their alienation at any time. Mr. C. WATSON: The Secretary of State concurs fully in the principle that a native, when once established, should be inalienable except with the consent of the natives themselves and upon its being proved to the Secretary of State that alienation is desired. When I informed the hon. member in reply to his question of the 17th of this month, that there was no prospect of alienation of reserves in the future, I did not mean to suggest that there would be no alienation or strip-enclosure in the future, but it is possible that circumstances may arise, such as the increase or decrease of a tribe, the failure of certain staple articles of food which in reserve, a deterioration in the sanitary condition, or which would render an alteration of its boundaries or location both just and desirable. I need scarcely say, however, that any proposed change of this kind would be most closely scrutinized by the Government, which in this matter, as in all others affecting the welfare of the natives, would act as their trustees.

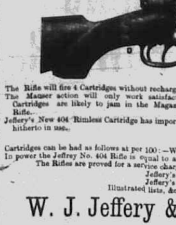

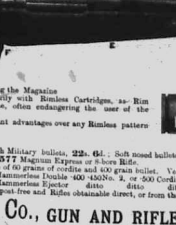

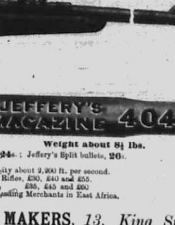

The Opening of the Legislative Council.

H. E. The Governor's Speech.

The opening ceremony of the Legislative Council was held on August 16th in the Railway Institute Building, Nairobi. There was present the attendance of Nairobi Residents and a Guard of Honour from the Kings African Rifles was drawn up to receive His Excellency the Governor. The H. K. R. Band was in attendance.

Prior to the Speech of H. E. the Governor, the Bishop of Mombasa, the Right Reverend Dr. Peel prayed for God's blessings on the future work of the Council. His Excellency then declared the Council open as follows:

H. E. THE GOVERNOR'S SPEECH. To open and give effect to the provisions of the First Legislative Council of East Africa.

The day is an important one in the history of the Protectorate and marks a distinct advance in Political Administration.

First administered in 1890 under the direction of the late Sir William Mackinnon the patriotic Chairman, and his Board of Directors of the Imperial British East Africa Company. East Africa was declared a Protectorate on the 1st July 1895 under the control of the Foreign Office.

During these periods East Africa has been steadily fortified in connection with the growth of such able and eminent Administrators as Sir George Mackinnon, Sir Arthur Hardinge, Sir Charles Eliot and the late Lord Salisbury. It is a pleasure to me to inaugurate the work of this Council, which is a mark of the progress of the Protectorate and the confidence of His Majesty the King in the ability and sympathetic interest in all its affairs East Africa owes more than is generally known.

Two years later the office of Commissioner is provided to that of Governor, an Executive Council appointed and the Legislative Council is opened in the annual of the country with the constitution of a Legislative Council, on which the Colonists and non-official European element are duly represented, and we begin to emerge as a Crown Colony.

The inauguration of this Council has been thought about in a prominent degree by the ruler with the settlers, which has been marked a feature of the last few years, and whose legitimate aspirations to have a say in the laws that govern them the local Administration and the Imperial Government have been ready to admit, and I am happy to see them now so far realized. I congratulate the Protectorate today and I heartily welcome the new Legislative Council. The public will now have a direct voice in the legislation of the country and a clear interest in its administration, which must be to the great good and benefit of all concerned.

Our officials will be in a better position to ascertain needs and requirements viewed from a different standpoint to occur, whilst it is to be generally it will be of the greatest benefit to have the official advice of such an able body of gentlemen as will sit on this Council. And I look as well on this occasion as the nucleus of relations between all classes who will now be brought into closer and more intimate touch. I feel sure, to my initial advantage and not least to our credit. After all, gentlemen, though not meeting on different lines and may not always see the same things eye to eye which is perhaps as well, we are really all working directly towards the same end—the making of this Protectorate.

In reality's Gazette publication was given to two masters of great interest. I refer to Lord Elgin's despatch reviewing the financial and administrative progress made during the two years the Protectorate has been under

the control of the Colonial Office and by the notification constituting the Local Board, five non-official members.

There are present in the Hall today those who have shown East Africa from the days of the Company and watched its growth from the time it came under British rule, some of whom have been very instrumental in bringing about the results obtained. If any of us are tempted to think that progress has been slow, that we do not advance so rapidly as we should, I would say, but at the large extent of territory with which we have to deal, the interests that have to be considered, and the numerous questions that come up for settlement, and remember that our staff as well as our resources are limited. Remember, too, that when there may be some impatience as delay in action in certain questions of more than ordinary importance it may frequently have happened that these very questions have been put under consideration all the time, steps taken to obtain all information connected with them, and a course of action proposed; though it may not have been possible to make a definite statement and anticipate a final conclusion till all the considerations bearing on the particular question have been fully weighed. If thoughtful minds will look back a few years and contrast the conditions existing then as they exist now, I think they will admit that very real progress has been made. I will ever go further and say that I doubt whether within the given time, remember only a few years—any British Colony ever achieved so much. We have changed and progress which have been achieved in East Africa.

His Excellency then proceeded to refer in eulogistic terms to the Official Members of the Council and to the Non-official Nominates, the latter individually, and reminded his members that it was his hope that all might be given strength, wisdom and guidance to properly conduct the high duties which His Majesty had been graciously pleased to commit to them.

The oath was next administered and ran as follows:

I, do sincerely promise and I swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King Edward VII, his heirs and successors according to law. So help me God.

IN answer to a Mombasa enquirer we may state that as far as we are aware the attempt to plant native police barracks, and parade grounds, with all their objectionable features, right in the centre of the land reserved for the residences of the non-official European citizens of Mombasa has been frustrated.

THE question of "spitting" is one which deserves the attention of our legislature. In order to grasp to the full the considerable extent of this pernicious habit is indulged in East Africa it is only necessary to glance at any Uganda Railway Station on a morning after a train has been standing alongside for a minute or so when it will be seen that the whole length of the platform is marked with the expectorations of passengers. It is impossible to conceive a happier hunting ground for germs than a third class railway carriage, a native passenger train on the expectorated matter and then takes his seat.
