TO THE EDITOR OF "THE EAST AFRICAN STANDARD." Sir, Having carefully read the Customs Ordinance (No. 10) of 1907, I am glad to see that it is contained in the Special Official Gazette of the 22nd inst.

Customs Ordinance.

Chapter 11, Clause 9.—The attendance of Customs Officers should not be entirely regulated by the Chief of Customs. For the collection and forwarding of goods, the officers should be at their posts at all reasonable hours.

Clause 17. (2) In the present congested state of the Mombasa Customs House, 72 officers should be employed to deal with the goods and I consider the time given for the goods to be at least 24 hours.

CRUSHED BY AN ELEPHANT. A REMARKABLE ESCAPE.

THE latest news of the alleged buried ivory, is that a Kikuyu chief has reported to the Government white man, supposed Sportman has been murdered some months ago and his ivory shared among Kikuyu chiefs, has been buried in the bamboo on the Aberdare range of mountains.

THE Currency Commissioners were wider awake than we gave them credit for. All our invested funds have not been put into one basket, as £4,000 has recently been invested Straits Settlements. £1 Inherited Stock now standing at 96½, on the whole a better investment than the Transvaal 3% Guaranteed stock of which the Protectorate holds 14.9 to the nominal value of £35,701-14-9.

THE Cape Times in publishing the announcement of the death of J. C. Bailie says that the deceased was a worthy descendant of the 1890 Settlers, who was always on the frontier of civilisation, taking part in their ball of the dead. As a big game hunter he was noted, and nearly a quarter of a century ago he penetrated beyond the Zambesi in search of sport and adventure.

Although seventy years of age, but a few days ago, he was speaking hopefully of his coming settlement with his wife at Nairobi, where he was to take up an important Government appointment.

Mr. Bailie had a grasp of South African problems such as few men possess, and was known throughout the sub-continent.

A European has been recently sentenced to a year's imprisonment after a proper trial by a properly constituted jury, for forging a check for a pair of boots. A native who recently presented a forged cheque on the National Bank of India has got off scot-free and so presumably all the other parties concerned, which is unfortunate, from the point of view of the general public.

THE Rev. P. A. Bennett writing to the 'Times' on East African Affairs says "We ask that we shall cease to be governed by Officials who regard crime and so presumably the demand for popular representation as privy conspiracy and rebellion, and that our higher officials shall have graduated in a wide man's college rather than in the autocratic atmosphere of an Oriental dependency."

HAND gifts for cotton of a similar but stronger type than those used by the Indian peasantry are now obtainable from the Government at 12s. 6d. per lb. each. Orders for such if given to the Collectors at the different stations will be executed as soon as possible. It is hoped that this will prove a great saving of labour by bringing of unginced cotton to Kampala from distant parts.

IN the forthcoming number of the East African Trade Journal will be found a description of the Anglo-Franco Exhibition to be held in London next year. Last year the Hon. Charles Chamber of Commerce was invited to nominate a member to join the London Committee. As far as we are aware the nomination has not yet been made though the invitation has been accepted.

A difficulty has arisen in Mombasa during the week. It appears a landowner obtained a signed permit from P. W. D. Executive Engineer to erect a building. Through the digging of the foundations for the proposed building, a neighbouring house was undermined and a half way began to collapse and there is a deadlock.

THE Warren Circus, as announced in last week's issue, may be expected shortly in Mombasa. Good reports reach us from Dar-es-Salaam, where the Circus is at present amusing the townspeople. Among the body artists are Mesdames Wanda, Aloha, Porena, Nora, Wandina, Anello and Ethel, all 'Stars' in their own line. 'Rings of Acrobats', Dancers, jugglers, and the Uganda railway programme nightly. In anticipation of this event the answer No. may safely be given to the world-wide question: 'Are we down hearted?'

WE do not believe that in any other portion of the Empire would a Bill as second reading so important to our people as the new Customs Bill be carried out before either the Press or Public. Bodies interested in the Bill had an opportunity of expressing opinions on its contents. Only one solitary member

of the Council has had any experience either practically or theoretically with the work of Customs business. A member has had yet no opportunity of hearing the views of the public, he must be presumed to represent. The whole procedure is a strong protest should be made by our Public Bodies to the Under Secretary of State for the Colonies when the opportunity occurs.

A whole page of the Official Gazette is devoted to informing the public how many mirrors, washbasins, and other household articles may or may not be obtained at Government expense by Civil Servants. We should have thought a circular would have been the proper mode of distributing these details which are given under the title "Furniture Regulations", not to him that hath, etc. An unfortunate Civil Servant who happens to be a European Post Master, Clerk (there is no definition of this title) or Police Inspector must by his own washing-tub or mirror, these articles of household use are evidently regarded as articles of luxury and not of the 'High Life', in fact a first certificate is allowed two of such articles but this is balanced again by allowing only one of each to the Deputy Treasurer General of the Protectorate. Thus the amusing portion of the 'Furniture Regulations' but there is a serious matter underlying that we have civilian importers of British made Bedsteads and household requisites and local factories turning out excellent furniture made from local iron, hard, and fancy woods at competing values yet, forsooth, it is not good enough for our local Government. Our Government must import direct most of the articles which it is considered necessary to hand out to the service and in what more there is a clause in the latest Regulations authorising certain parties to purchase certain furniture from the Public Works Department, and still we ask: Why this depression?

AMONG the choice 'bits' from the Home Press this mail are the following: "The big hotel at Mombasa where so many people stay before proceeding up-country owes its existence in a large degree to the enterprise of Mr. Goldmann." The next from 'Health and Home' the next 'par' is the outcome of an interview with the one and only David Garrick Longworth. "Big game is our staple industry," it is alleged Mr. Longworth said to an 'Express' representative recently. "You can shoot it from the windows of the Pullman cars on the Uganda railway, which, by the way, is equipped with electric light, lifts, and everything else that you would expect in the centre of civilisation." The London Daily Express representative still further indulges in his imagination as a result of the interview with the redoubtable Journalist of Nairobi. At the conclusion of a column of Big Game talk headed "Lions at Three a Penny" is stated "British East Africa would be an ideal place

for a Socialist colony. A man can live there almost without labour. He has bananas growing wild for food, banana beer for drink, and bark cloth for clothing." We fear the above is an instance where we may exclaim "Save us from our friends." Articles headed "Lions at Three a Penny" are not likely to induce the Big Game Sportsman to visit E. A. We have heard it said that the reason why Sportsman have given up this country is because of rumours of native rising. The truth is, however, we have frightened the Sportsman away by injunctions booming. A big game Hunter will take native rising risks along with his Sport.

Chapter VII.

Clause 103. Here we have a very important clause and one which deserves the attention especially of the Official Members of the Council.

All goods which shall be warehoused or lodged in any of the warehouses shall be stored therein in such manner as the Chief of Customs or other officer of Customs at the port where the same shall be so warehoused shall direct, and by the expense of the importer or owner of such goods, and if any such importer or owner shall neglect to stow the goods warehoused therein by him so that such goods may be held, thereon, or if any importer or owner using any of the warehouses or any part thereof, shall by himself or his agent, or workmen, discharge the storage of any other goods in the said warehouse, and shall neglect to properly re-stow the same, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rupees one hundred and fifty.

This Clause has been drafted by a Government Servant who naturally wishes to place the Government in as safe a position as possible, nevertheless, Official as well as non-official members of the Council have to take it that the majority of the Public interested receive equitable treatment and must not merely rest satisfied with an expression of opinion of any non-official member.

Clause 103. Here we have a very important clause and one which deserves the attention especially of the Official Members of the Council.

Importers, but it will press most heavily on the smaller importer. When arranged on the other compulsory revenues which accrue to the Customs Department, in addition to the ad valorem duty, are taken into consideration the least the Customs Department can do in return is to stow into its own warehouses at its own expense.

Legislative Council.

Second Reading of the Eleven Bills

Hurried Proceedings.

[BY PRESS TELEGRAM.]

The Council commenced sitting on Monday Sept. 2nd when eleven Bills were brought forward for discussion. The following members were present:—

His Excellency the Governor. The Hon. Secy. Commissioner, Commissioner of Lands, Treasurer, Crown Advocate, Manager of Railway, Lord Delamere and Mr. Wilson.

Bill for the Abolition of the Legal Status of Slavery throughout the East Africa Protectorate.

This Bill passed its second reading without much discussion, the introduction explained that the Bill was framed to interfere as little as possible with Mahomedan customs.

Bill to Amend the East Africa Volunteer Reserve Ordinance 1905.

The Bill passed its second reading, the only point which raised discussion was the inability of certain Mombasa Members to sign on for general service away from the Island.

The Hon. the Lord Delamere introduced any differentiation between the Mombasa and Nairobi Members.

The Senior Commissioner remarked that a Volunteer who was not absolutely at the disposal of the Government in an emergency, was not of very great value as a fighting unit.

Bill to Amend the East Africa Police Ordinance, 1906.

This Bill was read a second time with little or no alteration from the original.

TUESDAY 3rd. To make better Provision for the Levying of Customs Duties.

Chapter 1 and 2, Section 1 to 10 were read for a second time and

approved; Section 11 provoked a discussion. The Hon. Lord Delamere moved the deletion of the following:—

11. When any goods are seized by an Officer of Customs for any infringement of the provisions of this Ordinance, and any penalty or forfeiture shall have been adjudged in consequence, it shall be competent to the Chief of Customs to award to such seizing officer a part of the goods, improved, or of the proceeds of such goods, or of the proceeds of such goods, not exceeding two-fifths of the whole, after deducting the Government duty, if any, charges which may have been incurred by the Officer in the Government.

The motion was lost by 4 votes to 3. Under Chapter III, Clauses 16 and 17.

(1) Subject to the directions of the Governor, the Chief of Customs may from time to time approve and appoint warehouses at and near the port for the warehousing and securing of goods without, and may in such appointment direct whether such warehouses shall be used for the purposes of storing goods imported for home consumption or for home consumption and exportation or for exportation only, and all goods to be stored in such warehouses shall be stored in such manner as the Chief of Customs or other officer of Customs shall direct, and the warehouses shall be locked and secured in such manner, and shall be opened and unlocked at all times only and in presence of such officers and under such rules and regulations as the Chief of Customs shall direct.

17. No kerosene oil or inflammable oil shall be stored in any warehouse in any port without duty having been first paid thereon or any warehouse not specially provided or approved for the purpose of such storage.

17. The Government may, by notice in the Gazette" fix, from time to time, the rates of rent which shall be payable in respect of the goods deposited or stored in the Customs warehouses and yards in the Protectorate, and it shall be lawful for the Chief of Customs or other officer of Customs to detain the goods of any person who shall omit or refuse to pay any money due for rent on goods stored in any of the said warehouses or yards.

Goods landed at the Customs House except when otherwise provided for shall be allowed three days or a twenty-two hours (from the time of discharge of goods from the ship) rent free, and shall thereafter be charged single rents for a period, not exceeding seven days, and for every week or part of week in excess of that period, double rent.

Transshipment goods shall be charged single rent for the period of six months.

Until altered or added to, the rates mentioned in Schedule C to this Ordinance shall be the rates of single rents chargeable with the meaning of this section.

Where slightly altered on the representations of both of the non-official Members, Clause 19 was passed unamended and runs.

19. There shall be payable in respect of each licence the sum of rupees four hundred and fifty per annum and each such licence shall be renewable on January 1st in each year.

The Hon. Mr. Wilson opposed the mentioning of a definite sum remarking that it should be left to the discretion of H. E. the Governor, but his opposition met with no support.

Section 32, Sub-section (1) was slightly altered.

Section 33 provoked a prolonged discussion as to the exact meaning of the words ad valorem.

THE CUSTOMS BILL. Further Amendments Needed. [CONTINUED FROM LAST WEEK.] Clause 63. The Schedule under which the list of goods allowed to enter this country free of Duty should be augmented so as to include various articles in addition to industrial machinery, also articles required for iron manufactures, for example:— Iron, Copper, Lead and Composition Metals...

Clause 135, deals with the prohibitions and restrictions of importation. Among the prohibitions is the following:— Manufactured articles bearing the name, address or trade mark of any manufacturer or dealer, or the name of any plant in the United Kingdom or any British possession, calculated to import to them a special character of quality, Manufacture, and not of such manufacturer. To this sub-clause should be added a proviso such goods are imported after a period of three months has elapsed from the date of this Ordinance. Considering the severe penalty (£100) attached to any breach of this Clause, importation should be afforded an opportunity of warning their buyers against purchasing such goods. There can be no doubt that penalties will be imposed on those who are innocent persons, for though an importer can take all precautions against a species of fraud being practiced, it is quite impossible for him to really safeguard himself.

It is represented by the recent experiments of the British and French States that the largest and most powerful type of balloon is that of Count Zeppelin. It is constructed on the so-called "rigid" principle. The suspension cables last autumn. The Count's airship was 120 metres in length and with a diameter of 23 metres. It was piloted by Count Zeppelin and two motors he managed to drive through the air at the rate of 15 metres per hour. It is now met with new experiments for the German Empire granted him a subsidy of Latr. 25,000. On installing an apparatus for wireless telegraphy on his new balloon he expects to remain during his aerial flight in constant communication with a distant station.

MONDAY. On Monday morning the Bill to amend the East Africa Police Ordinance 1906 and the Masters and Servants Ordinance 1906 were introduced by His Excellency the Governor. It is "LEGAL STATUS OF SLAVERY." In discussing the Bill for the Abolition of the Legal Status of Slavery. The Hon. the Crown Advocate said that the Hon. the Attorney-General had introduced a "Female Member of the household who is an inmate of the house," and he moved that the Bill be recommended to a Special Committee composed of the members of the Council with the exception of His Excellency the Governor.

Clause 146, reads:— The Chief of Customs may from time to time fix the period after the expiration of which goods left on any Custom House or in any other place of deposit shall be subject to payment of fees, and the amount of such fees. Which if allowed to stand makes several previous clauses redundant. It is even further to be noted that the Bill provides for fees payable for wharfage etc, the clauses making this provision, can be over-ruled at the will of the Chief of Customs, and also the items during which goods may remain on Customs premises.

The object of the Ostrich Bill is to protect the Ostrich Farming Industry, which at present may be said to be in the early infancy. The Bill is based on the illicit Diamond Buying Act of the Cape Colony and creates a new list of criminals and provides penalties for dealing in Ostriches, Feathers, Horns or Eggs unless the person so dealing is authorised to do so by licence. The licence fee is fixed at forty five rupees for Ostrich Hides and three hundred rupees for Feather, Horns and Eggs. The latter fee is unreasonable as the only object of issuing licences in this instance is to enable Government to better supervise the industry and one quite sufficient to be in the early infancy of the industry. The licence fee is fixed at the nominal sum of rupees five and confined to those of European birth or descent, a somewhat foolish provision and one quite unnecessary. If an Asian, Baluchi or Native of East Africa is prepared to go to the expense, which is highly improbable, of purchasing and erecting, such pen enclosures as shall in the opinion of the Governor be necessary for the proper management of an Ostrich

THE TURF CLUB AND OCTOBER RACING.

There is an effort being made to repeat the experiment of holding a race meeting again in October. It is to be hoped that the stewards of the East Africa Turf Club will not sanction the proposal. Regular race meetings are a little more than the Club can well manage as it is and it is probable that disaster will attend any increase in the annual number of meetings.

At the last race meeting, which Book-makers are licensed, can only be regarded as an amusement and in no way do such meetings really assist the development of horse breeding in a country situated as is the East Africa Protectorate. The class of horse to be bred in the Highlands is the racing stamp, a horse which will serve for army purposes. It is not likely the Protectorate can ever compete with other countries more suitably situated, in breeding race horses.

It is possible to successfully breed a strong sturdy animal of the stamp of the Somali pony, an animal for which there will always be a ready sale in other and more populated tropical countries. It may be taken that the class of stallion which would be imported to local breeders for racing purposes is not the class of stallion which would be best and encouraged for sporting purposes. In any case Nairobi trade is in a state of serious depression and an extra race meeting will not help but hinder those struggling to keep their heads above the water.

MOMBASA VOLUNTEER RESERVE.

At the general meeting of Mombasa Volunteer Reserve corps held on the 30th of August, the following reports were passed to deal with shooting competition:-

RULES.

1. Shooting seasons to be from September to the February, during that period fortnightly shoots for a prize competition to take place on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays in each month.

2. Prizes to the fortnightly shoots to be:-

7. A member winning one of the fortnightly prizes to lose two points from his handicap each time he wins until he reaches zero.

IN connection with the approaching visit of the Under-Secretary for the Colonies to this country, the following announcement appears among the latest military appointments: Major The Right Hon. Winston Churchill, M.P., Oxfordshire Yeomanry has been granted permission to proceed to the British East African Protectorate and Uganda during leave of absence.

AN important cattle sale will be held on Saturday 28th at Fort Florence. Messrs. P. H. Clarke, Jd. will offer over one hundred and fifty head of Kavirondo country cattle that day. The sale is an important one to stock breeders in that the Kavirondo cattle, whether from Kisi and Kurung stand moving to other districts remarkably well.

THE Government have spent a sum of £1,000 upwards on a Boring Plant. After considerable expense in unsuccessfully endeavouring to find water in 1,000 feet and 1,500 feet, the Government have decided to purchase for at most much per diem. The Authorities have replied that they consider the idea impracticable. Why they consider the idea impracticable we have not been made aware but we should have thought that what was practically in South Africa would be equally practicable in East Africa. Possibly the Government may reconsider the matter. hundred feet in one or two places we can bring to his notice. We fear that if nothing is done with the new Plant it may be the way of the former Boring Plant, imported by the Uganda Railway, i.e. on the scrap heap.

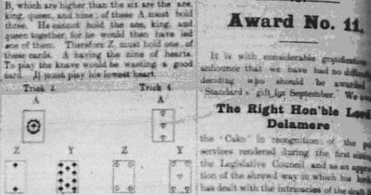

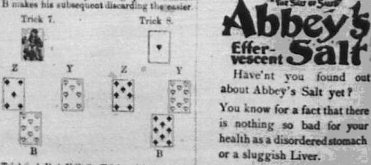
