WORLD'S NEWS BY MAIL.
A Mother Shot by Accident
A Liner Cargened.

While playing soldiers with a schoolmate at his age, a boy eight years of age, accidently shot his mother.

Protests with illustrious signatures rained in on the prefect of police, and no secret was made of the intention to leak up the performance if the Prince and Princess appeared on the stage. M. Legnie therefore refused, in the interests of public order, to allow the Prince and Princess to appear.

Received Wasps by Post.

Acts of vengeance such as that perpetrated on Miss Elvira de Naves are unfortunately rare. At her residence in the Parc Monceau quarter, says the "Petit Parisien," this member of the "haut monde" received by post a box, packed as containing a wedding cake, but which was immediately surrounded by a swarm of wasps and bees which stung her cruelly. The contents not being saved for the Hospital at Bellevue and the head of the "Petit Parisien" Department is searching for the author of this atrocious act.

Alleged Atrocities.

In Portuguese West Africa, Messrs. Nóbres and Frenas are now in England with the object of inducing Sir Edward Grey to take action regarding the alleged slave trade atrocities in Portuguese West Africa.

Ought he to declare spades in the hope of winning the three tricks needed for game, or make a bold dash at no-trumps, or leave it to his partner to do the best he can? The second in the course which the writer took is actual play—once more with a sensational result, for he lost two by cards and the game—but no matter, reflection he thinks that the call ought to have been left to the partner. At all events one would not, of course, insist on a partner make the best suit trump. The worst that can happen is that the latter will declare spades, and even then the dealer's goal may not be out of reach. Dummy would not declare a weak hand at the score.
