LOCAL STOCKYARDS.
Municipal Council Committee Recommendations.

ACTIONEERS PRESENT.

At a meeting of Nairobi General Purposes Committee, Councilors F. C. Handon in the Chair, Messrs. Brown and Lamboth were specially present. Capt. Batchelor, of Messrs. W. D. Thomson and Co., Mr. Dundas Smith, Mr. A. H. P. Standa, Messrs. Newland Tarlton and Co., and the Acting Council-masters of Police.

With regard to stockyards, the subject of the time having been explained, expressions of opinion were given by the actioneers. Capt. Batchelor objected to the proposal to make the use of the stockyards compulsory. They were infected with syphilis. They were situated at a distance from the town. Sites were not small and Mr. Handon said that it was not necessary to see that the place was cleaned up after every sale.

Mr. Handon said that the stockyards were in a very unattractive locality and should be completely done away with. In reply to questions the actioneers agreed that there would be no more than 200 head in Nairobi. The total sales would amount to about 1,000 head per annum. Nairobi was never likely to be a centre for stock sales.

Capt. Dundas Smith agreed that the compulsory use of the yards was undesirable, but Mr. Standa differed as he thought that it made little difference which site was used. Mr. Hagg in reply to questions stated that the yards would only accommodate 200 head. He would have no objection to letting others have the yards if required to make them over to the Municipality.

The actioneers having retired, Mr. Hagg's proposal was discussed. It was agreed after discussion to recommend:

- (1) That the use of the existing stockyards should not be compulsory.
- (2) That all sales should be held in the open air.

It was agreed that a report on the suitability of Mr. Hagg's yard should be prepared and that if it was found suitable recommendation should be made for its acquisition.

The Acting Commissioner of Police expressed the extreme difficulty of obtaining "stalling and lottering" and stated that it was impossible to make a law to exercise any effective control in this matter. He suggested either two or three yards under an Indian.

He would like to arrange temporary stalls for an Indian constable to be on duty at the stand of the Theatre Royal stand from 9 to 5 daily and that permanent stalls should be trained for this duty and paid for by the Municipality.

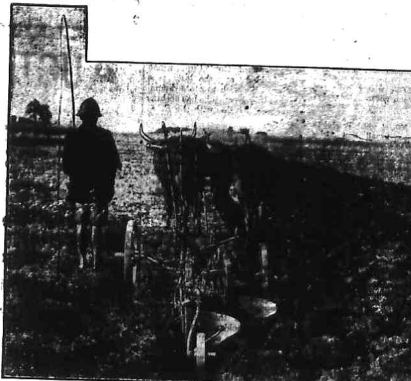

ELECTRIC RAILWAYS

The Future Possibilities in E.A. Africa. LESSONS FROM SOUTH. There is believed that when the B. E. A. Electric Railway which London has been countered, there will be no need for side-tracking goods trains for passenger trains to pass.

One feature of electrical working in South Africa is that trains run side by side on the same track. This B.E.A. may meet 12 electrically driven passenger trains on the same track. This is done by the use of the air brakes to stop them.

Comparison is made with the 12th class, with a load of about 100 tons, on a run in Witbank to Germiston, which covered the distance in 35 minutes, or 100 miles an hour. This is an electric locomotive which takes 2 hours to run from Capetown to Johannesburg.

A further feature of the report is that the electric railway is not only a means of transport, but also a means of power. The report states that the electric railway is a means of power for the irrigation of water power for the growth of the country.

A number of advantages to be derived from electric traction are mentioned. These include: (1) higher average speed for long distances; (2) greater weight and reduction in number of goods trains; (3) reduction of wear and tear on the track; (4) reduction of cost of maintenance; (5) elimination of costs connected with the supply of water and coal locomotives; (6) increased comfort for passenger and freight crew.

It is recommended that the proposed electric railway should be built on a main line for 100 miles, with 40 to 50 goods locomotives with a life of 15,000 hours, the cost of which would be about \$2,100,000. This would be a saving of about 600 tons per year of hauling a 600 ton load of coal over a distance of 100 miles.

NAKURU NOTES.

Settlers' Comments Upon Famine Traders.

CROP OUTLOOK.

(From Our Own Correspondent.) From a Market Garden I find the weather has been very good so far. If others will give their experiences it will help where "small" matters are so important to small settlers. Trials should be made of fax seeds brought from Holland, Russia, Indiana, etc. Because strange frosts occur, as in the case of Java Indigo grows in Natal, a new and very valuable indigo plant was produced that grows for four years and withstands frosts. The Indian Indigo industry began to revive before the war owing to this new plant. It grows some and sold the seed at about 1/4 per pound. This plant is the finest of all green manures.

Delphinium Anemonium is a remarkable flowering plant to be seen at this season at about 5,000 to 7,000 feet elevation on the Solai Hills near Mr. Reynolds' farm. On a stem about 3 or 4 feet, is a bunch of flowers of a curious and vivid mixture of blue & metallic green. Many thanks to the Messrs. Nairn, bi, for identifications.

Foreign Tractor. The trial on Mr. Dewar's land was held and well attended. No record were kept of fuel consumption but the practical work done was sufficiently good to induce a neighbouring settler to purchase the machine on the spot. And the argument is in favour of it, it is easier to purchase than teams of bullocks and to get drives, etc. etc.

The tractor has come to stay and if "graves" are kept in stock it will replace cattle traction. And probably the best argument in its favour is the area of land used for cultivation instead of grazing.

A Kikuyu headman learnt to drive one of the above after a short lesson.

We have not as yet had enough rain to let the tractors sink into the soil.

Tractors are the subject of the "taps" Listen at hotel dinners or elsewhere; "I bet I can beat the tractor with cattle, and the thing is to keep it from breaking down a day or two in getting spares, but it does not matter if one or two of a team break off, the rest can do the work." "You could start that tendency to run up an inflated leg if you hitched the plough on to the front axle suddenly." "That red male seems a good idea" "All this means that brains are at work, and the sure of good results when that happens."

One argument is that tractor breaking of land by contract would cost less than purchase of teams and ploughs. And that would give one a year to find out more about it. What is gained by the contract cost per acre? And what demand will there be for contracts? Make it.

I just received the amazing (joke) statement that 30 bags per acre has been raised off a maize crop in the Nyanza province. When one writes the papers one puts only the best out of the window for any particular pull. I hope to confirm this item shortly. For if it is true it will give this our beloved country a great stimulus.

Yes! In course of time we will gain a great maize export with elevation and bulk-ships. We have the land, we have the sun, and the jingo I will have the money too. Patience! The way I received the above statement was: "You was quite right about the 15 bags per acre, I have got about 30 bags, I bet you know when it's all weighed out. But I can't wait, I believe both in the possibility and the time when to come."
