(By the Bishop of Uganda.)

Information Disclosed for All Proposed.

ADVANTAGES CLAIMED.

The Editor, N.A. Standard. Sir,—I am glad to see that you will disagree with the very able criticism upon the above subject submitted by your correspondent Mr. A. B. Clarke in your daily issue of October 20th.

It is obvious to me that the Chief Native Commissioner's plan will fulfil more work and responsibility than the abolition of the employes. The procedure as expounded by the C.N.C. in your weekly issue of October 18th is about the most serious mischievous, milk and water policy it is possible to conceive—a regular pay for labour, and one who has had many years in which to study his subject.

I use the word "mischievous" advisedly, since there can be no possible objection in giving a native a knowledge of which he is cunning enough to take advantage.

Referring to the above quoted letter from the C.N.C. under the heading "How it Works," this looks really beautiful on paper and the Finger Print Section are prepared at a moment's notice and among lists of thousands of finger prints to discover a defaulter! Clock work's in it!

Criticism is offered, but the following corrective is easy: It is absolutely useless to give any native any proper criticism. Either the family get well on its own or will get better or become a disease carrier from him.

Really it is feasible and simple to provide every adult Native with a metal disc stamped with the initial of his District and District and his number. This disc should be of the metal used in watches for his person and any native found without such disc should upon conviction be arrested three months R.I. without the option of a fine.

Any native losing this charm must report to the nearest police station within 48 hours under penalty where he would receive a note returning him to his referee at his own expense in order to obtain a fresh one.

Every D.C. would be provided with discs and the means for stamping them whenever a native desired to leave his reserve. A record of all natives having a reserve would be kept in all district offices and thus cause confusion.

For example N.L. 8978 refers to Nyanza Province a Lombosa Nymanzari Arap Cheungwa. This man contracts to work for Mr. Kufura and disobeys N.L. 8978 is inserted in his official Character as "wasted" and immediately all districts are upon the alert and all Police Stations.

With the co-operation of the Press the matter would be further simplified. Unless some such policy is pursued the people of E.A. are being up and down trouble for themselves.

The present condition of the labour market is chaotic in the extreme and the facilities afforded to the black man to wander about and commit crime unchecked is criminal. The subject is a big one and worthy of a Commission composed, say, of half officials and half natives.

upon it without first consulting, or at least considering the interests of the people who are vitally concerned. In any case there is no excuse for halting in experiments at the expense of the public. Mr Hugh H. Healey, in the course of correspondence recently published in the E.A. Standard, has made pertinent remarks to make convincing the general policy of the Uganda Railway, and we give freely with him when he suggests that it is in high time people were made fully aware of the exact financial position of the Railway in relation to the development of the country. There are to be no two views concerning the value of the Railway in scientific production, but penalizing the producer by means of impossible freight rates would only result in decreased output, which is the very issue that ought to be avoided at all costs. The Government wants revenue and there are other ways of securing it besides interfering with the main avenue of commercial activity, and we therefore appeal for a large sense of responsibility and interest in making the additional demands required; otherwise, the country might suffer a setback in general development, from which it would take years to recover.

The E. A. Standard Nov. 7, 1919. Before another night has fallen on Nairobi, our popular Governor, Maj Gen Sir Edward Northey will have departed from the Capital of British East Africa on his homeward journey. We deem to take this opportunity, therefore, of expressing the community's sincere sympathy with His Excellency in his prospective sojourn, which renders his absence from the country imperative, and its equally sincere wish for his speedy recovery and return to the land of his labours in the course of progress and development. Lamentable as the mischance was that has severed temporarily the ties which bound His Excellency to the land of his administration, from those whom, however, "there is some good in things evil" should none observingly distill it out. The good in this particular instance is the fact that the enforced visit to England by Sir Edward Northey will provide him with the timely opportunity of conferring with the Home authorities on the pending and vital questions at issue in British East Africa. Personal negotiations are invariably preferable to voluminous correspondence, and we wish His Excellency all success in his future conferences with the responsible officers of the British Government. Sir Edward Northey will be in a much better position to take matters over than any man prior to his departure from England to assume the Governorship of this country, inasmuch as he has had the opportunity of actual personal experience. He has done this direct contact with the people, the life and the aspirations of the Protectorate, and he knows more of the feelings and the conditions with which the residents of

the country—officials, settlers and others—are faced. So far as Sir Edward Northey has satisfied his policy, it has given entire satisfaction to all concerned, which proves that he has the best interests of the country at heart, and engenders the hope that he will continue to apply for the introduction of measures, tending to the general welfare of the Protectorate. Judging by recent speeches, Sir Edward Northey will find a sympathetic listener and a staunch supporter of road progress overseas in Viscount Milner, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, as well as Colonel Amery, the Under Colonial Secretary, and the country once that was heard to utter should be of a premax character so far as the future of this country is concerned. Certainly Sir Edward Northey can continue to count on the unstinted support of the people of this Protectorate in his efforts to alleviate the present disabilities, and generally place the life of the country on a sounder and more stable basis. In view of the importance of the issues involved, it is not inopportune to suggest the resumption of the most vital matters requiring attention. In the very first place that concerning exchange and currency and on this matter Sir Edward Northey will be able to add his testimony to that already tendered by Major Greig as to the tremendous drawback from which the Protectorate is suffering. He will be able to speak with first-hand knowledge of the country's handiwork in this matter, and he will be accorded strong support in his arguments by the House of Commons by the combined population, Indian and European alike. We shall have more to say about this position later, and it is merely mentioned here as a factor which should serve to strengthen the Governor's hands in subsequent discussions. The £5,000,000 loan, which has been selected for but remains in abeyance, is another matter that Sir Edward Northey will doubtless find an opportunity of pressing for. This money is required largely for developing the country's communications, a very vital issue in a young country's development. These works, more than anything else, would tend towards a large measure of productivity and orderly in handling the output, and on their completion the country should make a real and marked stride forward. While on the subject of railways and harbours, attention should be drawn to the rates on the former and the arriving of cargo at the latter. Some definite understanding should be had as far as the Uganda Railway is concerned, and it is suggested that an end to the imposition and subsequent withdrawal of far-reaching penalties. Of course, this is largely a matter of internal policy, but a clear definition of attitude by the Imperial Government with reference to the Railway
