

And in the interim, while B.E.A. is stalling and waiting, the industries are collapsing, and money is vanishing from the country, and eligible settlers are being warned off, we have the poor consolation of seeing our neighbours who enjoyed more enlightened Government during the first days which added B.E.A. with Indian law and Indian currency, going about with money in hand to take the best of the situation in the rest of the world. A slip into the South African mail now coming to hand shows new enterprises ahead of all over that country, and million sterling being put out in capital, and no little in the note twenty-five new industrial and commercial undertakings, headed by the National Industrial Corporation of Africa, Ltd., formed with half a million capital and power to do its best cooperation of the initiative of the National Bank of S.A. Ltd., with a view to financing and fostering industrial undertakings in Africa. It will especially devote itself to the encouragement of industrial enterprises by means of financial aid and otherwise as may seem desirable. Another company with £20,000 will be the representative of the iron and steel industry. A third will trade in building materials, a fourth with £10,000 as a business, etc., a fifth with £20,000 as a business of pig-iron, and a sixth with £10,000 as a business of pig-iron.

It is an assumed he is making arrangements to visit Zanzibar early in September. Mr. W. M. Sexton writes from Mombasa by correct statement that he and Mrs. Sexton are waiting for a boat. He adds: "I have no intention of going home at present and will return to Nairobi about the 6th of September."

The happy knock that bamboos cart owners have of dropping stones of varying sizes in the roadway, resulted in a local resident sustaining a serious fall when cycling home in the dusk on Wednesday evening through striking one of these pieces of wandering masonry with the front wheel of his bicycle. "East low rice" is the latest appeal. The Secretary of State has intimated by cable to the Governor that owing to the Indian rice crop being a failure there is an acute rice shortage in the Far East Colonies. His Excellency therefore appeals to Europeans to abstain from eating rice as far as possible for the present to ameliorate the state of affairs amongst those native populations who live almost entirely upon rice. A very diminutive fish appeared before the Magistrate yesterday, charged with theft of a pair of shoes, and a Crown case. The learned judge had to be absent on a case to be heard on the same day. The case was then adjourned only just before the late admitted charge.

PRICE OF RUPEE Farmer Explains His Handicap HEAVY EXPENSES

To The Editor, S.A. STANDARD. Sir,—Although I am more familiar with the plough than the pen, I feel that I must write and thank you for the interest you are taking in those who are affected by the present exorbitant price of the Rupee. For months we farmers on the Plateau have been very worried over the exchange question, and although we set our hopes in the Government, nothing appears to have been done. The assistance that we are now getting from Guley and Roberts will be a considerable help to us and I assure you that it will be appreciated in our district. The Ploughman farmer, as you know, cannot afford to pay inflated prices for his ploughs, etc., owing to the heavy railway charges and cartage expenses inland. I think it would be a good thing if the Government would give us free railage on all our implements. When I get back I intend to put this up at our next meeting. GERMANY'S SHIPS Berlin Confesses Heavy War Losses London, Aug. 19. Reuter learns from Berlin that the German Navy losses in the Baltic, as now estimated, were 26 submarines, of which 178 were lost in open fighting and 18,854 personnel perished in those vessels.



Caenozo Barrett's Answer

Nakuru, Thursday.
 In spite of occasional showers, the programme at the time of arranging for tip-top weather favouring Nakuru race meeting, which seems to be a noteworthy success. Plans of functions has been arranged by an energetic committee, the programme is generally regarded throughout the district as the best of the year.
 The number of visitors has already increased, and it is expected that there will be a record crowd in Nakuru during the week-end.
 The race, in common parlance, is almost a clock-work, and marriages are being hastily run up in the Hotel Club grounds in order to provide accommodation for the overflowing hands now busy during the final arrangements.
 The week-end programme is of a high nature, and should provide an entertainment in plenty, which will begin to get busy early Saturday morning, committee meetings of the Pastoralists' Association and the Nakuru Race Club should for 9-30 a.m. and 10-30 a.m. respectively.
 The next meeting is due to begin at 7 p.m. and will be followed by a concert at the Hotel at 9-30 p.m. Monday, a big Gynkhana will be commencing at 2 p.m.

The "Times" foremost of the Daily Bulletin Commission's final report says it finds that insufficient consideration has been given to ensure safety at the original heading, and the difficulties were grossly underestimated.
 The Commission strongly criticises the attacks at Amara and Surva Bay, largely attributing the failure to family feuding and censuring several commanders, particularly at Surva Bay.
 They unambiguously agree with the decision of evacuation, but state that they were not so unadvisedly deluded. They also say that Gen. Sir Charles Montgomery's view, commended by Kitchener, ought to have been decisive.

A cutting from the well-known county journal "The Field" contains the E.A. Standard by yesterday's date containing an account of a lecture given in the East week of July to a large London audience by Major Ghogan, following are the points "The Field" says.
 "If any doubts had existed as to the interest which is being taken in the prospects of settlement in the East Africa Protectorate they would have been removed by Major Ghogan's lecture last Tuesday under the auspices of the Overseas Settlement Commission.
 "Mr. T. C. MacMahon, of the Colonial Office, who is Vice-Chairman of this Government Committee, presided over a crowded meeting, the notes suggested for the lecture at Carlton Hall were well received, and many stood outside round the open door for the hour and a half occupied by the proceedings.
 "It was a good lecture, Major Ghogan is a fluent speaker, and he tried to present a balanced account of the conditions and prospects awaiting settlers in East Africa. One point which he laid out is the variety of soils and conditions of cultivation considered not only in the highlands, but within particular districts.
 "It does not follow that because a district is situated in a coffee district that it is suitable for coffee growing."
 "No one, said Major Ghogan, can say what is the value of a farm or what land is adapted for merely from its location. Such questions can only be settled by inspection."
 "We did not seek to minimise the climatic difficulties. The conditions in the highlands are not so favourable as first-like those of a perpetual spring or early summer in this country. But the fact that the country lies across the equator makes the equator itself an adverse factor in the health of Europeans.
 "If proper precautions are taken the danger is slight, but Major Ghogan said that he thought there were in which white children were sometimes allowed to run about in Nairobi without any hair whatsoever."
 "The altitude which makes the temperature so delightful is also an important factor. A man should always have himself the opportunity of getting away from the country for a change to sea level, and should not tie himself up financially so as not to have this recourse at his disposal."
 "On the financial side of the question the rate in the exchange value of the rupee from 1s. 4d. to 1s. 1d. is a serious matter to a man of small capital. It means that if you leave this country with a certain amount of money its equivalent value in East Africa is reduced by one fifth, compared with its value at the time of its exchange."
 "On this subject Major Ghogan advised intending settlers very strongly not to take out more money than they are likely to want for immediate use, but to arrange with one of the banks to draw on the branch in East Africa from time to time for any further sums that may be required."
 "With regard to the Government scheme of land grants, he said he believed it was the best scheme that could be devised under the conditions."
 "Questions which were asked after the lecture showed that most of the audience were doubtful whether it would be profitable to work the farms in the absence of labour. On this subject Major Ghogan refused to commit himself, saying that it all depended on the individual whether or not a farm was made a paying proposition."
 "The general impression left by the meeting was that there are good opportunities for the right sort of man, but that success is very likely to be avoided, and that action must be prompt to get out in the pioneer spirit—one man who asked about the rates for the transport of furniture was advised to sell it and leave it to the Government. The speaker was ardently in sympathy with the spirit, and a vote of thanks to Major Ghogan was passed with much enthusiasm."

Mr. I have both much interest in the various views expressed on this subject, and it appears that the subject of a Dual Currency has not met with anything like universal approval. This can easily be understood, as many complications are likely to arise during the time such dual currency is in force, particularly if the rate of exchange varies in its present state of uncertainty. I am, however, of opinion that it is possible to simplify the method of altering our currency, and put forward the following brief suggestions:


