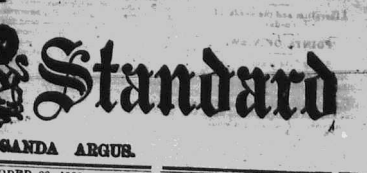

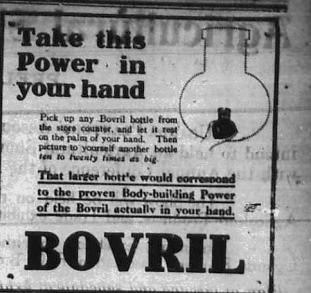
LITHUANIA AND POLAND.

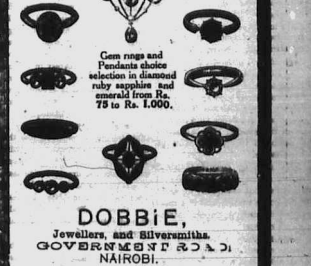

NATIVES SEE RED.

Starting and Tragic Outbreak in South Africa.

ARMED POLICE FIRE ON MOB.

25 KILLED & 41 WOUNDED

"E. A. Standard" Special. From our own correspondents. Port Elizabeth, Oct. 23. A very serious native outbreak occurred here today. At about 11 o'clock 22 people were killed and 41 wounded, including several Europeans. The wounded Europeans mainly received their injuries as a result of being struck with shot-burns by natives.

The affair is generally regarded as being the most tragic in the history of the town.

Natives had been agitating for some time past, protesting against the new laws, and the Police yesterday arrested their leader, Mashelela, the president of the Native Workers' Association.

This evening several thousand natives armed with a variety of weapons assembled in front of the Police Station, and in a most insulting manner demanded Mashelele's release.

Large numbers of Europeans, in their women and children, however, on the outskirts of the crowd of natives. The natives rained stones and threw a variety of missiles, and some of the Police were wounded. The Police exercised the greatest patience and forbearance.

Mashelela is well known throughout the Eastern Province. He is the son of a Kaffir, and is a graduate of the Natal Native College.

LARGER INCREASES ON WEST COAST

COLONIAL OFFICE VIEW.

"E. A. Standard" Special. From our own correspondents. London, Oct. 23. In the House of Commons today, Brig-Gen H. Omyers Sibson, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., (56 Un-visited), lodged a complaint regarding war bonuses for East African Civil Servants.

Mr. Omyers, Under Colonial Secretary, in reply said the maximum amount of war bonus for East African officials was fixed at £120, the amounts diminishing for higher salaries, because it was considered that the need for an additional bonus was the greatest in the case of smaller salaries. He had no reason to suppose that exception was taken at any time to the scales of bonus as being inadequate.

Under the new rates of pay, he said, no official received less than his full entitlement, and that the war bonus and duty allowance which was not drawn during absence of absence, as March 31 last in most cases immediate increases over those entitlements were realized, and future prospects materially improved.

He said no reason to suppose that a general substantial improvement had not been secured, but the application of the new rates was still the subject of correspondence with the Governors and Sir Alfred Lees.

The view was generally that officers serving under the same conditions must receive the same pay for the same work, irrespective of the financial position of the Protectorate. He said that the Government recognized that the interests of any scheme for improved

Schemes for Expansion now Deferred.

LATEST POLICY.

"E. A. Standard" Special.

London, Oct. 22. Speaking in the House of Commons today, Col. Army (Under Secretary for the Colony) said that owing to the ultra depressed state of the cotton industry, all schemes for the expansion of cotton growing in Uganda had been completely dropped for the time being.

Col. Army, Under Colonial Secretary, in reply, said he was unable to check the figures as so short notices, but many of these Grants had been rendered long and unprofitable. Moreover, from these earned salaries which form the point of view of a European manager would be regarded as an adequate initial salary.

Many salaries of non-European employees, he added, were very much lower than those of the other part of Mombasa Bay lowest paid Europeans, apart allowance from the extra cost of leave passage and retention, and he was afraid that the general substitution of non-Europeans by Europeans would be impracticable on the ground of expense.

Col. Army stated that the Government of Kenya Colony was negotiating with the British technical advisers and the Government of Kenya Colony. The persons interested in the new scheme had full liberty of action to proceed with their scheme but it was not known whether they were doing so.

Col. Army stated that the Government of the Colony's arrangements in regard to railway and other construction were not sufficient, but provisions were being made to provide facilities for the development of the country.

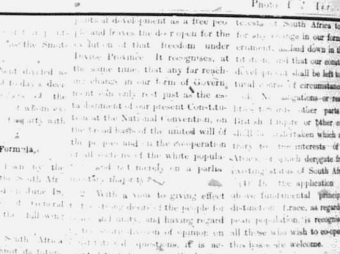

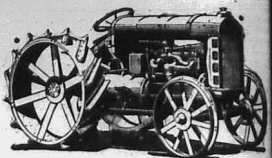

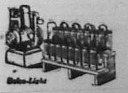

But we do not recall that that gentleman's very valuable report on the subject, which is commonly believed to have been the basis of the recent improvement in salaries—containing any suggestion for the new scale, which is the most interesting of the unpleasant character, that of that inspiration is a matter for interesting speculation. We may, however, be permitted to hope that among the matters now under discussion between Sir Alfred Lascelles and Sir Edward Northey, this may not be lost sight of. It might, perhaps be well if members of Parliament were kept more up to date. The demise of the late Lord Amery was announced several months ago in the Colony as having taken place as from April 1 last. It is large indeed in the way now in which it is otherwise. It would be more fitting, in our view, if both locally and at Home, the final consideration should be to prevent all justice to the official servants from degenerating to unnecessary extravagance. That may be remembered with advantage when the Legislative Council meets in Nairobi next month.

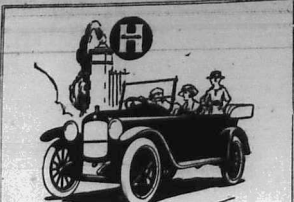
