For Nairobi

PART TIME OFFICIAL

During meeting of the Nairobi Municipal Council certain steps were taken under the Health Bill, and a consideration was given to the proposal to make his office a permanent one and to give him a salary and a pension.

The Mayor, Mr. J. H. S. Todd, referred to me by the Acting Chief Veterinary Officer.

"I am of opinion that the population of Nairobi is not large enough to warrant the appointment of a Veterinary Officer, and I agree with the recommendation of the Acting Chief Veterinary Officer that no Veterinary Office would be required."

"The Veterinary staff is now being recruited, and it is hoped that the new Veterinary Officer will be appointed in due course, and the proposed merger would not materially interfere with his other work."

"The Mayor further requested me to detail a veterinary officer to the Colony to take charge of the storage of stock and supplies, and to act as a veterinary officer to the District when necessary."

"I agree also that for the time being, the Veterinary Officer should be made available to the public outside the Colony."

"It would therefore suggest that the local procedure would be to do what has been done in the past, namely, to pay to the Nairobi District Veterinary Officer to carry out his functions, and to allow him to be employed during official hours in doing municipal work, and to be paid accordingly, and the Nairobi District Council should bear the cost of this officer's salary."

"In order to prevent any difficulty which might readily arise in connection with the payment of the salary of the Veterinary Officer, it is suggested that the Government rate per month when the Veterinary Officer used his services should be fixed at £100 per month."

"The sum required to be paid to the Veterinary Officer should be drawn from the funds of the Nairobi District Council."
