It was stated authoritatively that it is for the Soviet Government to accept or reject Britain's final terms, which take up an overriding role regarding Bolshevist propaganda in Britain and the Middle East, and also regarding Russia.

U. S. A. & PEACE TREATY Withdrawal from South West of Ambassador.

London, Jan. 26. Roster learns from Washington that it is stated that the United States has decided to withdraw from the Conference of Ambassadors in Paris.

While official quarters do not confirm the statement, it is admitted that the Government will not be represented at the meeting of Allied Premiers next week. Official quarters point out that representation on the Ambassadors' Council is necessary in view of the failure of the Senate to ratify the Treaty.

Red Forces active. The War Office reports considerable activity at Naghsheer and Shiraz, an area 20 miles South of Herat, Persia, where the Red's artillery shelled a British post on December 26 and December 27, and the Red infantry drove in the post. Subsequently our reinforcements recaptured the position and followed up, drove off the enemy picket south of Shiraz. We had two wounded, and killed two. One wounded and one prisoner. A hostile force under the cover of darkness took up a position north-west of Naghsheer on December 28, but was put to flight by our troops, leaving nine killed and two prisoners, including a Russian officer. Two machine guns and thirteen rifles were captured.

Curzon approves Soviet. London, January 6. The Foreign Office publishes a telegram, dated Dec. 21, from M. Curzon, of the Soviet Government, regarding responsibility for the protection of commercial negotiations, and declaring his readiness to accept the trade agreement entered into last summer and to enter with the British Government in reference to the latter's subsequent elaboration of the political clause thereof.

Lord Curzon, Secretary of Foreign Affairs, to-day replied to M. Chicherin in reference to the Russian Minister's suggestion. Lord Curzon specially recalls the delays caused by M. Curzon's intervention in the matter, and declares his intention to take more active part in the reconstruction of the country.

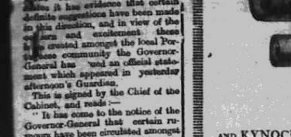

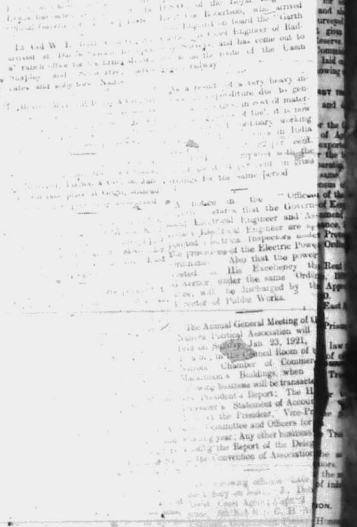

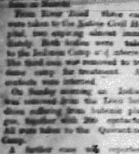
