THE ANAS ASSOCIATION AND THE "CODLIN FRIENDS."

We have received information on an advertisement appearing in the edition which led to the meeting at the Victoria Hotel, Nairobi, on July 8, the resolutions passed in which were published in our issue of July 12, and are reproduced here.
