WORLD'S NEWS BY CABLE.

Wireless Telegraphy and Rescue at Sea.

Loss of "Slavonia."

June 14.—The Cunard Liner "Slavonia" is ashore of the Azores. Six hundred passengers have been landed and it is feared that she will be a wreck.

The passengers of the "Slavonia" were saved by German liners which had been summoned over 180 miles by wireless telegraphy. The rescued passengers are proceeding to Gibraltar.

Another Severe Earthquake. Casualties not yet known.

June 14.—Severe earthquake shocks occurred in southern France on Friday night and 8 persons have been killed owing to the collapse of a house at Lambec. The population of Marseilles panicked and rushed into the streets, many passing the night in the open.

The earthquake also caused a panic in Cannes, Nice and numerous other towns in the South of France. Windows and chimneys were broken everywhere and there are reports of buildings collapsing and persons buried in the ruins. The death roll up to the present is 50.

It is now believed that hundreds were perished in France owing to the earthquake. Numbers of villages have been ruined, one was demolished by a cliff falling on it.

55 Killed.

June 15.—Although 55 have been killed and 200 injured by the earthquake in France, fatalities were mostly in villages between Aix and Avignon, there were none in large towns.

The Referendum.

June 11.—There is feverish excitement and monster demonstrations are being held in Natal on the eve of the Union Referendum. The Premier, Merriman, Fisher and Botha have telegraphed to the Electors hoping that they will declare for unity.

Natal in Favour of Union.

June 14.—The result of the Natal Referendum is 11,121 votes for the Union, 8,701 against it.

The New Land Act. Awaiting His Majesty's Sanction.
