The three principal markets of the world with which our New Colony is in close touch are the markets of Europe, India and America. The American market is the most important.

Passenger mail for the journey from the Cape to the East African coast is carried on the mail steamers of the British East African Company.

Freight rates for the New Colony are based on the rates for the Cape. The Government has recently issued a new tariff for the New Colony.

As regards sea freight the tenderly will be towards reduction, even at the present time the Companies are open to negotiations for reduction of freight on large quantities.

Country grown produce is especially well favoured for instance tobacco. The Government has recently issued a new tariff for the New Colony.

A Seething Lake.

In various parts of the earth, notably in the Antilles, in Java, and in Italy, may be seen the craters of semi-extinct volcanoes.

But probably the most interesting of these all is that on the western coast of Italy near the Bay of Ischia. A great lake of furiously boiling water, about a mile in circumference, is said to keep its bounds by a low volcanic embankment not more than about twenty to sixty feet high, and is almost constantly covered beneath crust or eruptions of solidified mud, upon which those of the visitors who are not afraid of the heat mud giving way beneath their weight, and causing them to sink their heads in the fiery interior of the earth, crumple up, and expire the martyrs of this natural subtlety.

In various directions pits and jets of white sulphurous vapours are constantly emitted, the sulphuric odor being so powerful that it is necessary to keep to windward of the lake, when a portion of the crust has either been removed, or has broken in the furnace, hot water may be seen, not more than about a couple of feet below the surface.

Hot, and in most places contrast to the sultry and awe-inspiring appearance of this strange crater, at one end and another have been erected, probably, like the crust floating on the steaming water upon which many varieties of flowers grow luxuriantly, including a considerable species of most beautiful white heather in full bloom, which, together with long spikes of the most attractive and novel of flowers, grace and beauty, luxuriant in the midst of weird and grim surroundings.

And perhaps the strange feature which rendered more of the figurative "lake of fire," that burning, consuming, remorse and bitter persecution which will be the inheritance of those against their Creator. But a way has been opened by which, instead of the inheritance of glory and reward, joy can be attained on in the favour of the world, who to him, since himself suffered the punishment for them. And he who would come into Him, and make him a child of God, and share his life.

THE LAMBETH CONFERENCE. The Lambeth conference is over and the Resolutions of 243 Bishops of the Anglican community are published to the world. The following are the chief resolutions in brief.

Science and Faith. The historical facts stated in the Creeds are an essential part of the Faith of the Church. Clergymen should be encouraged to work abroad for three or five years. Athanasian Creed. The Primate should take steps to have a new translation of the Quotations Vult. As the use of divorce is not a term of communion the several churches may do so for themselves which is desirable. Non-Resistant. Purely secular education is educationally as well as morally sound.

Church and Divorce. The purity of their life is the basis of all national stability. This, in fact, as our Lord's words expressly imply, divorce, except in case of adultery, the Christian Church can never recognize in any other than the putative divorce, or give any sanction to the marriage of any person.

Native Theologians. An advanced theological and practical training should be given the ablest of the native mission clergy. Native forms of marriage (not polygamy) may be consecrated. Elastic Principles. In revision of the Book of Common Prayer the following principles should be held in view:— Statutes adapted to present customs generally accepted. Redundant parts removed, and suitable additions made. More alternatives in forms of worship. Change of obscure words. Revision of calendar and tables of proper seasons.

Church and Socialism. The conference urges upon members of the Church practical recognition of the moral responsibility involved in their investments. This moral responsibility extends to— (a) The character and general social effect of any business or enterprise in which their money is invested. (b) The treatment of the persons employed in that business or enterprise. (c) The observance of the requirements of the law relating thereto. (d) The payment of a just wage to those who are employed therein.

Church and Socialism. Clergy are urged to set forth the truth of His presence, "that all may realize and feel that of the substance of the tabernacle Spirit to sanctify both soul and body, and thus to gain a fuller conception of the Holy Spirit, and to be able to witness to those of themselves or others."

THE PAN-ANGLOAN OFFERING. The Archbishop of Canterbury has issued a statement outlining the allocation of the Pan-Angloan fund offering. Total offering £345,000. Estimated Church property lost in 1905-6 £100,000. Primate's estimate £15,000. To be specifically devoted later £200,000. The Jamaica estimate that all money contributed in the British Isles will be spent on or behalf of work carried on outside Great Britain.



Our Newest Colony.

Article No. VII. Markets-Imports and Exports-Trading Methods-Cash and Credit-Industries-Material-Prospective Enterprises-Linking up the Sea. Trade in 'Our Newest Colony' is on the increase. The bulk of our Imports come from the United Kingdom and of our Exports to America, France and Germany. The principal goods imported are for the use of the Native, cotton cloth, holding the field against all other goods, a salient trade is a good second. The imported goods such as Provisions, Building Material, Agricultural Implements and Iron and Steel, Spirits, Tobacco, Books and Goods purchased from Great Britain, 'Oftens' from America, Bombay and the United Kingdom. Russia and Austria find the local markets holding out an increasing demand for Flour. In the future it is estimated that the Cotton Cloth, Iron, Flour and household Soap at present imported, will be supplanted by local production.

The leading Exports are Ivory, Hides and Skins the greater portion of which eventually reach America, although the United Kingdom and India in sub-Bombay and London take a heavy in substantial quantity. The trade in these commodities is annually decreasing. 
