Bygonos and co-operate with their Serbian Brethren's movements in Crete, Servia and Montenegro are causing anxiety and calculated to inflame the situation.

Oct. 10.—Greece has assured Turkey that she did not inspire the Cretan proclamation and hopes that it will not disturb the friendly relations.

The Greek Minister in London says that he does not doubt that Greece will accept the Union. Any Government not doing so would be ousted in five minutes.

Mr. Winston Churchill speaking at Dundee said that nothing serious will happen in the Balkans but the crisis has emphasised the need for a strong navy.

The Stock Exchange is gloomy and stocks are falling.

Four British warships left Malta yesterday for Lemnos. It is understood that Turkey has asked for British support.

The Montenegrin Parliament has been urgently convoked.

Lord Ripon has resigned on account of advancing age. Lord Crewe succeeds him retaining the Colonies. Altogether 4 Battleships, 4 Cruisers and 4 Destroyers have left Malta under Prince Henry of Battenberg. Other ships are hastily docking. It is officially stated that they are going to watch events. The excitement in Servia is moderating.

Isvolaky is in London.

Lord Fitzmaurice's Appointment.

Oct. 14.—Lord Fitzmaurice has been appointed Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster.

War Practically Impossible.
A Great International Conference.

THE NEED OF A SETTLEMENT OF THE BALKAN INFLUENCES ONCE AND FOR ALL EMPHASIZED.

Oct. 12.—M. Clemenceau in a striking speech denounced the Anti-Militarism Revolution and the feeble guarantee. It afforded for Treaties and against forcible aggression.

It emphasized the necessity of military power for France and he would do his utmost to extend it. It is understood that the British fleet cruises in the Aegean Sea to prevent a repetition of the Greek raid on Crete of 1867.

At the Skoptzina crowds assembled clamouring for peace. The Premier on being interviewed said the position was very critical and hostilities could hardly be avoided. There is unprecedented political activity in London.

On Sunday, the King breakfasted with Sir Chas. Harcourt and afterwards conferred for a long period with Sir E. Grey.

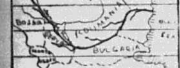
Britain has informed Greece that she cannot make any promise regarding Cretan aspirations and her conditions are restored.

Italy is distinctly favourable to a conference. Greece has asked Britain France Italy and Russia to consider the Cretan question at the conference, simultaneously with the questions regarding Bulgaria and Bosnia.

The Skoptzina has a secret session of 4 hours' duration on Saturday and continued yesterday.

The meeting was not attended as to what passed, but it is learned that the meeting was stormy and cooler after an explanation by the Foreign Minister.

One reason why hostilities are impossible is the scarcity of ammunition for the new batteries, which is the way, but detained on the Austrian frontier.



An Ultimatum.
King Ferdinand's Triumph Entry.

Oct. 14.—King Ferdinand made a triumph entry into Sofia on Monday with much pomp and received an ovation.

The Sofia correspondence of *Le Matin*, Paris, reports that Bulgaria is determined to leave the question of her independence to a conference, but will demand Turkey to name

distly recognise her independence, failing an answer in 3 days she will declare a war.

It is understood that Sir E. Grey and Lovolsky have agreed on the necessity of a Conference and it is now probable that other questions will be included besides Bosnia and Bulgaria.

There is a growing feeling among the powers that the best compensation to Turkey would be a guaranteed loan.

ULTIMATUM DENIED.
Turkey Suspicious.

Macedonia in Danger.

Oct. 15.—At Sofia an emphatic contradiction is given to the report that an ultimatum was given to the Porte, but a disquieting feeling prevails while Bulgaria remains fully armed.

The Young Turks in Macedonia believe that Bulgaria contemplates the seizure of Macedonia while Turkey is unprepared.

Skoptzina Crisis Ended.

Oct. 13.—The Skoptzina has reached no decision, but the crisis is regarded as over.

It is officially announced that the conference between Grey and Lovolsky affords reasonable ground for hoping for a satisfactory solution.

The Unemployed and Suffragettes Sentenced.

Oct. 13.—Several gatherings of the unemployed in Parliament Square were early dispersed by the police.

Oct. 13.—A great force of police was posted in Downing Street in view of a projected monster demonstration of Suffragettes at the opening of Parliament.

The Suffragettes demonstrate today. Three of their leaders announced for inciting to riot have returned to prison.

Oct. 14.—Trafalgar Square, Whitehall and Parliament Street were yesterday thronged with unemployed, but mounted Police constantly scattered them.

The Suffragette leaders have been arrested.

Oct. 15.—37 arrests including 24 women have been made as a result of the demonstration made by the unemployed and the suffragettes in the vicinity of the Houses of Parliament. Several have been injured and are in hospital.

Seven Suffragettes have been sentenced to from one to two months' imprisonment for failure to find sureties.

Many of the unemployed demonstrators have been bound over to keep the peace while others received one to three months' hard labour.

Oct. 14.—Sir John Vilfers, presiding at the South African Convention declared that it would not dissolve until a durable scheme for creating a united South Africa within the Empire.

Oct. 14.—The Spanish balloon in the Gordon Bennett Race fell 6,000 feet in Saxony, the envelope ripping, none of the occupants were injured.

Resignation of Sir Daniel Morris.

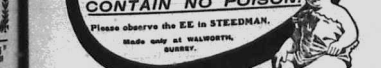

The Right Rev. A. R. Tucker, D. D., L. L. D., who paid a visit to Colchester, held a confirmation service in the parish church, the candidates being Cecil Ferns, daughter of Mr. H. G. Barclay, Colney, and Dorothy Callaghan, daughter of Sir George Barclay, K. C. M. G. of Westbury, Hampshire, at Colney, on the Sunday morning. WORLD'S NEWS BY CABLE.

Parcelling out Countries.

The Powers Arrangements.

Oct. 16.—Ivolsky is having daily and prolonged conferences with Sir E. Grey and has agreed that the question of the Danubian will be arranged separately between Turkey and Russia with the benevolent assistance of Britain and France.

Britain, France and Russia have agreed to submit a programme to the Conference of the Power replacing the articles of the Berlin Treaty with new clauses recognizing the independence of Bosnia and Crete and the independence of Bulgaria, also determining the financial obligations of Bulgaria and Greece towards Turkey with respect to Rumelia and Crete.

The Montenegrin articles will be replaced by a single clause removing all restrictions imposed on Montenegro.

Turkey Warns the Powers.

Bulgaria must Cease Military Activity or Take the Consequences.

Oct. 17.—Turkey's note to the powers draws attention to military activity in Bulgaria and warns that Turkey will reluctantly be compelled to take precautionary measures, but declining the responsibility of a conflict.

Ivolsky has proceeded to Paris and stays a few days there. Thence he goes to Berlin.

Most of the past week's programme is an important development of Anglo-Russian friendship.

The Balkans Situation.

Oct. 19.—The German Press gives a cool reception to the Conference proposals and declares that compensations at the expense of Austria and Turkey are not acceptable.

England is acting in agreement with Russia and has confidentially communicated to the other cabinets a slightly modified programme.

There are some divergences among the powers regarding them, but it is believed they will be removed.
