WORLD'S NEWS BY CABLE.

Labour Success in Australia.

April 19.—The Melbourne Ministerial House and Major have been defeated. The Laborites captured 8 seats in Victoria, and 5 in New South Wales. A Laborite won the Third York in Hobart. The Laborites anticipate a majority of 4.

April 19.—The House of Burgoyne has issued complete returns and the Laborite net gain is shown as 16 seats. Labor seats number 45, Union 27, Independent 1, and Independent Laborists 2. It regards the Senate Government as being only a minority in Victoria and Labor in the other States.

April 19.—The Laborites won three seats each in Victoria, New South Wales, and Tasmania for the Senate.

The Chronicle of Melbourne states that the feature of the Elections is the eclipse of the Socialists and Imperial Powers.

A Laborite Defeated.

April 18.—The resolution of the Laborite Taylor demanding legislation to enable Free Unions to impose compulsory levies to support Parliamentary candidates was rejected. The resolution was opposed by Liberals, Union and Socialists and was not accepted by Government.

Labour Wins.

April 19.—The following is the final result of the Melbourne elections: 20 Free Unions, 11 Laborites and 4 Independents. The Laborite majority in the Senate will probably be 12.
