WIRELESS.

His Majesty Returns

April 29.—His Majesty arrived in London. Prince, Princess of Wales, Asquith and Churchill met him at Station.

The King and the Situation.

April 29.—The King had audience with King yesterday on Political situation.

The King Anxious to be Free from Parties.

April 29.—Replying to an inquiry from a correspondent, King said the King's Secretary wrote that His Majesty was anxious that he himself should be kept out of Political control.

The King and Kitchener.

April 29.—Kitchener had most cordial audience with King who handed him Baton of Field Marshal.

Series of reports to Kitchener to future ministerial duties and suggestions for a more fitting post. Haldane replied that Kitchener almost immediately would take up duties. Haldane also asked members to withhold their criticisms till he was in position to deliver Kitchener's duties which he added with much respect to Alps, South Africa.

Kitchener was welcomed at Southampton by the Mayor and other officials. Kitchener held a luncheon at the Uganda Club and he was delighted to return to England and to see the changes, especially the growth of the electric railways, motor cars, and other things.

Kitchener's speaking regarding his travels and he was greatly impressed with the development of Australasia. The people there showed keenest interests in improving defence. He was delighted with Japan and the all pervasive activity efficiency of the Army. Regretted he was unable visit Canada, that it would have been poor compensation to hurry through that country.

Kitchener was received at Waterloo by Kitchener representing the King, Lord Roberts and other officials drove off in motor with Roberts amidst great cheering.

Seely on Home Rule.

May 6.—Seely speaking at Henson protested against the attempt to link the fate of Home Rule with that of the Lords. Referring to Home Rule in Ireland he declared that it was proposed to give Home Rule to the Transvaal the Boers were denounced by the Tory leaders as unworthy to form part of the Empire. Now it admitted that this opinion was utterly wrong and that there was no letter from the Boers to either Lord Botha and that his Dutch fellow citizens were among our most loyal subjects, he anticipated that the same would support Home Rule in Ireland.

Pearcy Receives the Gold Medal.

May 6.—Percy received a special Gold Medal from the Geological Society of London for the Albert Hall where 10,000 were present. The Medal was designed by the wife of Capt. Scott. Barrett received a silver plaque.

Earl Grey's Prophecy.

May 6.—At Ottawa, there was an unusual scene when the address was presented to Earl Grey. It was read in the presence of both Houses. Earl Grey replied to the amazing developments of Canada and how it was impossible to prevent her becoming the freest, most richly endowed and most powerful of the Empire.

Milner's Sound Advice.

May 6.—At a banquet to Hon. Sir John Lubbock the president did not believe that the country was angry with the Lords, but that violent reactions in the House of Commons necessitated proportional representation. Milner thought that the House was not so much angry as it seemed. He set out in plain language that he was convinced that the situation would not be settled with the views of extremists on either side.

Roosevelt on International Peace.

May 6.—At Christiania Roosevelt addressed the Nobel Prize Committee on International Peace. He thought the cause was advanced. He said that if the world could be united by all peoples, provided honour and respect were maintained, it would be possible to settle all international disputes peacefully. He said that the United States would support any effort to bring about a permanent international justice consisting of a Court of Arbitration.

All that happened in the United States as a Supreme Court, where differences between States should be submitted, thereby, he emphasized, proved that something should be done as quickly as possible that will bring the growth of amity, especially Naval, by international agreement, that no power could be used independently. He concluded by saying that it would be a matter of time if the great powers, happily have in peace, formed a league of peace not only to keep peace themselves but to prevent, if necessary, other breaking the peace.

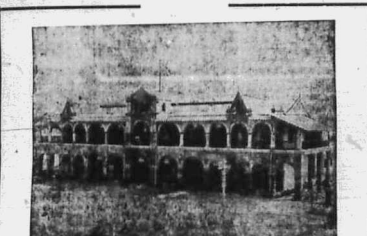
