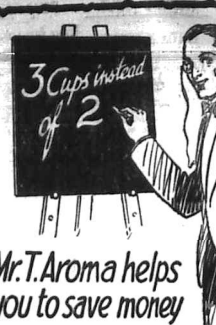

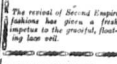

British Government's Fear for Europe.

ANOTHER BOMB DRADDOON.

Disclosure in the Lords and House of Commons.

[FRANCE'S POSITION IN AFRICA.]

London, August 3.—The House of Lords, in its own course, speaking on the European situation, said in substance that the Government was unable to find in the Franco-British alliance sufficient material to Germany's present attitude as to Germany's attitude towards the definite progress of an early settlement of the Ruhr situation, or of the reparations demands.

The Government held the firm opinion that the existing position could not be reached, and that the situation may not be retrievable until a crisis has occurred as yet changing detailed views. It had therefore decided upon continuing its views and policies with the Allies in spite of the objections of their own statesmen. The might weaken the world of the representations of prompt and an end to it.

Italy expressed general agreement in the British view and proposals in the British Draft.

Lord Curzon disclosed the contents of the great British draft reply. In this opinion was expressed that it would be advantageous to agree to a further proposal of an impartial commission, but in cooperation with the Reparations Commission, of Germany's capacity to pay. The draft pointed out that the German offer of guarantees did not mention the stabilization of the mark in balance of payments, and that the contract should be a permanent and some form of international control over the German financial administration was proposed.

The draft concluded by advising Germany immediately to withdraw the assurances which furnished a positive political policy and discussion. It expressed the belief that the Powers occupying the Ruhr would then necessarily proceed with a view to the resumption of general relations in Germany industrial life.

A reference made to the Allies elaborated the British view on the subject and urged that after Allied discussion should not delay the Franco-British reply. It was concluded in a cordial spirit, but did not mention the draft of the British reply.

Mr. Stanley Baldwin's statement in the House of Commons was identical with the foregoing.

Lord Curzon, following Lord Curzon's reply, discussed and explained that they formed our only guarantee under the Treaty to ensure Germany meeting her obligations. The latter was an intricate step and ought to be a part of the Ruhr.

It was not far to see what circumstances were going to do before it had gathered public opinion from the repeated criticism of the papers. If that question was put to do not know how he could point answering it.

World Trade to Fall.

In the Commons, Mr. Stanley Baldwin, referring to the situation emphasized that British interests were not less than those of Belgium and France, and extended the effects of the Ruhr situation, or world trade.

He offered a grave warning in regard to the possibility of a German collapse or the effects of worldwide depression by Germany.

The Government would continue to strive to bring together the Allied Powers, and to secure a just settlement. It was not to be expected that any such settlement would be reached. Mr. Baldwin concluded by expressing

his desire to maintain a warm friendship with France.

Opposition Confidant.

London, August 3.—The outstanding question of the day was the British attitude towards the Franco-British alliance. It was hoped that the British might see a way out of the situation. It was pointed out that the British conception of the alliance was not cooperation, but one in which any of the partners could stand against the other's own interests.

The Hon. Mr. Macdonald asserted that no sane man could say he believed that France was in the Ruhr for the purpose of getting reparations, but rather that she was persecuted by a warlike feeling. He proceeded to examine the terms of the conditions of France, which he declared were much better than those of England. He questioned the desirability of further negotiations, and suggested that the Government's best step would be to delay any action.

Dealing with the action, he attached great importance to securing Germany's admission to the League of Nations, notwithstanding the opposition, and suggested that the Government in its adoption of a positive policy.

Official Comments.

The Times: "What next?" came up the bill of the occasion in the morning newspapers on the European crisis, which all agree in regarding as of the gravest character. The Government's statement is by no means greeted with a chorus of approval, though the opinion is generally expressed that negotiations with France are still at a standstill and that the publication of the notes tends to appeal to the dispassionate judgment of the world.

The Times also cordially approves of the Government's explanation, and its selection of the whole of the correspondence, which it regards as a definite step forward and the very best thing it could do to secure the ground for the pursuit of a peaceful policy. It hopes that the statements and the strong expression of opinion they provide will give an important factor in the situation.

The Daily Telegraph reads into Mr. Stanley Baldwin's statement a determination not to be satisfied with further and further delay in connection that we must agree to differ from France and set on our own account, but to better purpose than France did originally.

The Westminster Gazette observes that the Government's appeal to the public opinion of the world is the first essential step towards working out a definite British policy for salvaging Europe, but it needs to be surgically followed up.

The Morning Post, which apparently has difficulty in recognizing the necessity of the step for France with support of the Government, today remarks that the Committee should have made designated France had it seemed better to have suggested Belgium.

A Concluded Position.

Perhaps the only constructive suggestion is made by the Daily Express, which says it cannot suppose the Government's proposals have so far without considering the position likely to be brought about by the withdrawal of the League of Nations, which would leave France and Belgium isolated. It suggests that the Government should consider the possibility of a German collapse or the effects of worldwide depression by Germany.

The other papers are generally in agreement with the Times, though there is still no sign of any definite policy. The Morning Post, however, has a somewhat different view, and concludes with a note of optimism.

The Daily Mail is of opinion that the Government has cast its net to the winds by adopting an attitude profoundly distasteful to the Daily Express.

The Daily Express declares Mr. Stanley Baldwin's statement to be a confession of their impotence and a request for the Government to take the somewhat humiliating position in which it has placed the British nation.

Business Men's Views.

The Daily Herald remarks that what Mr. Stanley Baldwin is doing is not to propose a policy or to see the Government any good. He merely is pointing out that five years ago Great Britain threw the whole of its manhood and resources into the struggle on the side of France and Belgium, and her choice now is between separate action or paralysis, as Franco-British co-operation seems to be at present impossible.

NEXT INDIAN MOVE.

Shall Sir T. B. Sapru Heckle the Conference?

London, August 3.—It is reported that Sir T. B. Sapru has called the Government of India for instructions on the question of bringing the Revya deputation before the Imperial Conference in view of the 1921 resolution.

It is understood that Sir T. B. Sapru's general attitude towards the Conference will be largely controlled by the reply from the Government of India.

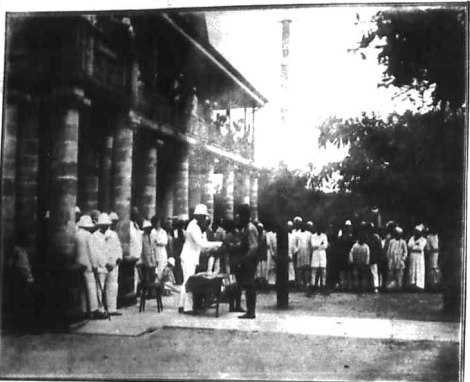

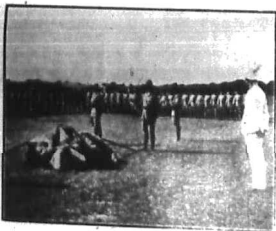

DISTRIBUTION OF WAR MEDALS BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE ACTING GOVERNOR AT MOMBASA

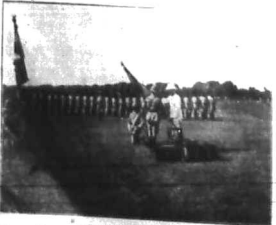

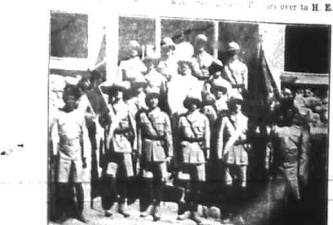

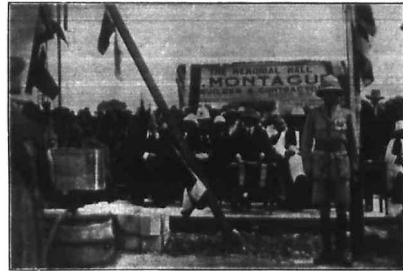

Progress Proves Wisdom.

"The recorded progress of our people, materially and spiritually, in itself proves the wisdom of the inherited policy of non-involvement in Old World affairs," said the dead President in his inaugural address delivered at the Capitol, Washington on March 4, 1921. "Confident of our ability to work out our own destiny and jealousy guarding our right to do so, we seek no

part in directing the destiny of the Old World. We do not mean to be entangled. We will accept no responsibility, except as our own conscience and judgment, in each instance, may determine. Our eyes will never be blind to a developing menace, our ears never deaf to the call of civilization. We sense the call of the human heart for fellowship, fraternity and co-operation. We crave friendship and harbour no hate."

[In an address to the Senate when submitting the treaty and resolutions approved and adopted by the Conference on the Limitation of Armaments, the late President made the following very explicit remark: "If nations may not safely agree to respect each other's rights, and may not agree to confer if peace or may not agree to advise if one party to the peace is threatened by an outside power, then all accepted efforts to tranquillize the world and stabilize peace must be flung to the winds."

Age Limit and Duties.

A President of the United States must be over 35 years of age and a native citizen of the United States.

He is Commander-in-Chief of the Army and of the Navy and of the Militia when they are in Federal service and he appoints and dismisses all officers.

He conducts the foreign policy of the Republic and, with the approval of the Senate, negotiates treaties with foreign Powers.

Paris, August 2.

A summary of the French reply to the British Note is published in the Bulletin. It is pointed out that the British Note and the German proposals of July 7, but declares that the question of the passive resistance of Germany is anything else is touched. The occupied territory will be treated as a separate entity with Germany's all other interests.

As soon as Germany's passive resistance ceases, the Franco-British occupation will be made as lenient as possible, but until any such modification of the French Government, the French Government asks whether such a body would be better than the Reparations Commission.

Reparations.

In regard to the British proposal for a complete allied plan for a general definitive financial settlement, the reply recalls the fact that such a plan already exists and that the Reparations Commission has all the facts necessary to enforce its application.

It suggests that it would be contrary to the treaty to reopen the principle of settlement and that of fixing a total figure. It asks what British means by "a general definitive settlement" and whether it includes interest on debts.

Referring to the question of security, it declares that the French Government is always ready to discuss this question independently of the occupation of the Ruhr, which must be dealt with separately.

COAST MAILS LOST.

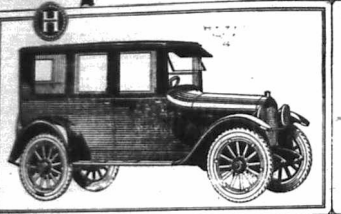

About Flour Milling.

In view of certain statements which are being made with reference to the sale of local flour it is necessary to state that the sale of local flour is rapidly increasing and it is now being sold at about all the wheat grown in the country. In the last 18 months we have sold more than one million 48 lb. sacks of flour. The quantity of wheat that is imported is rapidly decreasing. During the month of March 1923 the total quantity of wheat imported was 11,335 bags, value £12,250, less than 449 bags per week. The wheat available in the country, and on the waterways, is not actually now milling, have a combined capacity which is in excess of the total quantity of flour, local and imported, consumed in the country. The wheat harvested this year is likely to be insufficient to keep existing mills employed to full or combined milling capacity.

**THE TRUTH
About Flour Milling.**

In view of certain statements which are being made we think it necessary to publish a few cold facts. The sale of local flour is rapidly increasing and is now sufficient to absorb all the wheat grown in the country. In the last 18 months our sales alone have more than quadrupled, yet our mill is not working to more than one-third of its capacity. The quantity of wheat flour imported is rapidly going down. During six months ended March 31st, 1922 the total quantity imported was 11,355 bags value £18,200, less than 340 bags per week. It will be less during the current six months.

The mills existing in the country, not on the water or in the air, but actually new milling, have a combined capacity considerably in excess of the total quantity of flour local and imported now consumed in the country.

The wheat harvested this year or likely to be harvested next year will be insufficient to keep existing mills employed to half their combined milling capacity.
