A DASTARDLY OUTRAGE IN NAIROBI

MAN APPARENTLY SHOT IN COLD BLOOD.

What appears to be a most brutal and cold blooded murder was per-petrated on an Indian Schamba near Nairobi on Sunday morning last, between the hours of eight and nine o'clock.
