My Lord,

I have the honour to submit for Your Lordship's decision a point which has arisen in connection with the privilege of free medical attendance enjoyed by members of the Protectorate Service.

- 2. In certain districts where the Medical Department has not been able to detail a Medical Officer for duty owing to paucity of staff, efficers have found themselves compelled to call in private practitioners on behalf of themselves and their families and it is thought somewhat unjust that they should have to pay fees while their more fortunately situated colleagues are attended by the Government doctor free of charge.
- 5. I would therefore venture to submit for Your Lordship's favourable consideration that such fees may be refunded, it being of course clearly understood that if a Government Medical Officer is available
