The modified text now submitted from Lourenco Marques would however appear to meet the objections originally raised, and I have the honour to recommend tnat it be embodied in Article V of the Agreement. I enclose a copy of that article as amended and have the honour to ask that should Your Lordship see no objection the Agreement may now be ratified.

Sir.

In reply to your letter of the 22nd August, 1908, No. 618/08, that accompanied the proposal of alteration of article V. the provisional postal agreement concluded between this Province and the British East Africa and Uganda Protectorates, I have the honour to inform you that according to instructions I have received from my Home Government, the modifications proposed by your Administration cannot be accepted completely, it being convenient to adopt the following wording which is submitted to your opinion: "It is agreed that either of the parties to this Agreement shall arrange for the transit of parcels addressed from countries out of the Agreement to the other party. The transit charge to be paid to the Province of Mozambique for a parcel for whatever weight not exceeding 5 kilogrammes shall be 50 centimes (5 d.). The application of this charge shall, however, be restricted to cases where parcels are conveyed by railway; in cases the Province of lozambique is requested by the other party to this agreement to arrange for the transport of parcels by other means than that already mentioned it shall be entitled to levy special charges in connection with such conveyances on giving due notice of the same. In addition to the credit of 50 centimes (5 d.) per parcel, the terminal or transit charges to be credited to the Province of Mozambique shall be subject to modification, according to the respective destinations, the following:-Transvaal

For the rest of the countries there shall be exchanged, periodically between the two Administrations, a statement of credits to be made.

Justifying this new wording, I have the honour to put forward the following considerations, which I think indispensible.

- (a) There is no inconvenience in eliminating the following from the primitive text:- "And the combined transit and delivery charges to be paid to the same province shall be 75 e. (7½ d.)".

 The terminal charge of 75 cents(7½ d.) in favour of MoZambique being already pointed out in article IV there is no need in being again referred to in article V which should only refer to transit charges to be credited to this Province.
- (b) The part of the projected alteration proposed by your Administration which refers to the application of the Consitectory of 50 centimes to sea going ships cannot be accepted as that transit charge can only remunerate the land conveyance by railway, as foreseen in the primitive text.

The hypothesis of parcels being landed in one port of the Province of Manuambique to be forwarded by sea to another part also of the same province what is not regular, having to be excluded, it is to be supposed that the words "by the sea route" of the modification proposed by your Administration, refer to sea transit from your Office to the port of Manuambique nearest to the country of destination of the parcels. This sea transit should, however, be subject to the sea dues of the general Convention or the ones resulting from special agreements and having to be paid by the British East Africa to Post Offices or Companies of which the steamers are dependent of cannot be included in the transit dues of 50 c. (5 d.) which can only remunerate the land service by railway within the Province of Manuambique.

(c) The first part of the projected alteration which refers to the means of conveyance to be employed in Mozambique that demand special 483 charges can only be accepted with the suppression of the words: "and if in the course of development of the contiguous British or German Colonies.

Those means of transport which are specially the dear conveyances made by porters, exist already for the exchange of parcels with various South African Colonies and, as it is seen from the Table A. of Transit through Mozambique, demand high dues in the direct relations with the North Western and North Eastern Phodesia.

Therefore there is no necessity in speaking about the development of the contiguous British and German Colonies, as basis for receiving special charges.

(d) There is no inconvenience in accepting the period of the draft modification which begins with the words "In addition to the credit of 50 centimes (5 d.) per parcel" and preceeds (sic) the indication of the South African Colonies to which Mozembique gives transit.
