My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's despatch No. 328 of the 22nd of June last the Superintendent of Telegraphs has brought to my notice that it is most difficult to allocate proportions of salaries against Telephone or Telegraph work where the duties are performed by the same persons.


2. He asks therefore that "Personal Emoluments" in his Department may remain as heretofore in the Estimates and that a footnote may be inserted to the effect that a $\frac{1}{3}$ of the salaries should be debited against Telephone Maintenance.

3. I understand that this figure represents, as near as it is possible to calculate, a fair charge against telephones and trust that the proposal may meet with Your Lordship's approval.
