Sir,

I am directed by the Lord President of the Council to acknowledge the receipt of Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 12th instant, enclosing the draft of an Order in Council for establishing a Court for the hearing and determining of Appeals from His Majesty's Courts in the British Protectorates of East Africa, Uganda and Nyasaland, and to say in reply that His Lordship concurs in the terms of the proposed new Order in Council establishing a Court of Appeal for the Protectorates. His Lordship also concurs in the proposed amended form of preamble to the Eastern African Protectorates (Appeal to Privy Council) Order, as also in the proposed amendments to Clauses 3, 4, 5, 6 (a), 10, 11, 12, 14, 25 & 27, and in the proposed addition of a Clause (30) providing for the commencement of the Order. I am to add, as regards Clause 3, that the fact that Rs.10,000 still remains the appealable amount in India under the new Indian Code (Act of the Governor-General in Council No.V. of 1908) furnishes an argument in favour of retaining the same amount for East Africa. As regards Article 12, I am to suggest that the words "if any" at the end of that Article may become unnecessary, if the


