Expenses of Southern frontier Inspector.

With reference to your telegram of January 6th the
Crown Agents state that during 1908 bills for £1,000, £700,
and £350 were drawn by Adis Ababa Legation in connection
with Mr. Zaphiro's expenses.

Expenses incurred up to March 1907 necessitated the
first bill. The second and the third were for balance to
that date, and on account of expenses up to March 1909. A
bill was drawn by Sir J. Harrington for three years' ex-
penses up to October 24th 1908.
