1908 and substituting it for the original Art II in
that Agreement?

If so, two courses appear to be open

1/ That the SPS shd "approve & confirm" the Act
of 30 March 1908 forthwith (in the form on
1047/62); and shd similarly approve & confirm
the supplementary agreement when made.

2/ Wait till the latter is made and then
approve & confirm both Agreements together.

In other words, I share the difficulties felt by F.O. in
para 2 of their letter. The original agreement of
30 March 08 having been signed, I do not see
how you can alter Art II by the instrument
approving & confirming it, and I think this
alteration must be effected by a further
agreement. This being so, I advocate
alternative 2 supra [No 2] would apparently
create a [false] position].

? Suggest to F.O. that Art II having been revised
by the Courts concerned, the new Art shd be made
the subject of an agreement supplementary
to that of 30 March 08, and that when this
has been done both agreements shd be
approved & confirmed by an instrument
modelled on that which they supplied
on 1047/62 (N2)

Sir:-

I am directed by Secretary Sir Edward Grey to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 20th ultimo, 33663, enclosing the Draft of an Agreement between the Post Office of the East African and Uganda Protectorates and the Post Office of the Portuguese Province of Mozambique.

I am to observe that, although this instrument is referred to in your letter as a draft Agreement, it purports to have been actually signed at Mombasa in March 1908; and if this be so, it is not clear to the Secretary of State in what manner it is contemplated to effect the amendments proposed.

Sir Edward Grey accordingly feels some difficulty in expressing an opinion as to how the approval and confirmation by the respective Governments of the Agreement can best be effected.

I am at the same time to draw attention to the fact that the use of the word "ratification" in Article 15 is incorrect, and to refer to the last paragraph of the letter from this Department of December 7th, 1907, (38269), in which it was explained that "ratification" is strictly an attribute of the Sovereign, and is only applicable to instruments bearing the Royal Sign Manual.
