I have the honour to report that Mr Zaphiro, British
Inspector on the Southern Abyssinian Frontier, has been
taking active steps to counteract the machinations of
Balambaras Walda Gabriel, reported in my Despatch No 62
of the 24th ultimo.

He took possession of all the principal roads to the South, and caught three Boran Chiefs named Tazo Karayu,

Hassano Djilo and Hassuma Adeno, who had been sent to the natives of Debel with orders from Walda Cabriel and Gedu

to call together the Chiefs of that country and tell them that the British had no rights over any portion of the Golbo except the Charri district, and that if their people di not at once come up to the highlands, they would be raided and their animals confiscated.

Mr Zaphiro then summoned a great meeting of the

tribes

chiefs being substantiated, their horses and spears were confiscated and they were sent back to Walda Galriel with a passage that any Al ssinian or Boran found intriguing south of the red line would be punished and his property confiscated, and that the Balambaras would be held responsible for the consequences. Herr Schubert appears to have supported Mr Zaphiro in his action, and a good effect generally has been produced. The German Commissioner was reported to be at Gadaduma, at which place in Zaphiro was proposing to set out at once to meet him.

With regard to the murder of British natives referred to in my Despatches Non 6 and 60, Fitaurar Marta Cirris Carried out his promise and sent Fitaurari Waldi from Gardula to institute the necessar investigation at Marimo. Several hundred of the principal hunters were assembled before the Fitaurari, and in Zaphiro tought fo ward has charges on behalf of the Chiefs from the South whom he had brought with him. Other charges were also made, including one for the arrest of Mr Vincent of the Homa Tracing.
