My Lord,

I have the honour to enquire whether it would be possible to approach the Foreign Office with a view to instructions being given to H.B.M. Representative at Adis Ababa to send copies of reports on Abyssinian Affairs which may affect the Administration of the frontier districts to me.

2. These reports would be of great interest and assistance to this Government and, though they eventually reach us even now through the medium of the Confidential Print, much time would be saved if the procedure suggested could be adopted.

3. If it is considered impossible to do what I propose may I ask to be furnished with duplicate copies of those portion of the Confidential print which deal with Abyssinian affairs. I think that in many cases it would be of great advantage for the officer in charge of the Northern District to see them and, even if it is permissible to have copies of them taken in my office, as to which I


