## INTELLIGENCE.

It is reported that in the event of Menelik's death that Fitaurari Apta corges, Nagadares Haida Georges Itaiyah Faitu the present Emperor's wife, and many other influential Abyssinians will refuse to acknowledge Yasus as Emperor. Yasus is said to be the son of Menelik's daughter, who married Ras Michael. Ras Michael was formerly a Mahommedan but became converted to the Christian faith before his marriage. The reason given for the Abyssinian objection to Yasus is that many of them believe that he is at heart a Mahommedan and will make Abyssinia into a Mahommedan country. Itaiyah Faitu is not the grandmother of Yasus, whose mother is said to have been the daughter of Menelik by a former wife.

The Tigic instigated by Fitaurari Apta Georges, Nagadaras Haida Georges and Itaiyeh Faitu are reported to have risem in revolt against Wakshum Obata who was appointed Geverner over them by Menelik; heavy losses are reported on both sides but the Tigic have been temperarily defeated and their leader Duduch Abraha gaptured.

The inhabitants of 19 Gurren villages have left British and entered Abyssinian Territory, as owing to Marchan raids, they do not consider their lives or property are safe under British Protection.

The Marchan recently sent a large raiding party against the Gurreh at El wak. The Gurreh ard Ajuran waiting against them, defeated this party, killing 25 of them. The Gurreh and Ajuran lost one man killed. Owing to lack of water at El wak the Gurreh have had to move most of their stock to Yagleh and Dadableh element the Marchan country.

The Marchan have attacked the Rer Afgab at inidiannot far from Deld, raiding 100 camels and killing ly man. The Marchan lost 19 men and 6 rifles.

As a result of the above raid the Rer Afgab from Italian territory have raided Dolo, camping on the groun lately occupied by the Roma rading Company for 9 days and waiting for the Marsham to attack them. He Marsham appearing, they recrossed the Juba at Hillichid taking with them large quantities of Guawen stock. The entire Guawen population fled to Eugh and Banesia leaving their stock behind them on hearing of the approach of the Rer Afgab.

The Lensan from Italian Territory are reported to have attacked the Marchan killing 7 of them and raiding 100 cattle and 60 camels. Yaban are reported to have peared

They rebed three sheep and a quantity of milk from villagers, but had no time to nunt.

They are reported to have re-entered Abyestian territory. This report is confirmed by atto Degutho Abyesimian official at Famok, who informed no today that he had heard they had entered his district.
