Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 25th instart (14535/1911) further respecting the proposed grant to married officers in the service of the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates, when accompanied by their wives and families, of a small allowance to compensate them for the increased cost of travelling to East Africa by the ships of the Union Castle Line.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Harcourt that while Mr. Hobhouse was informed by Colonel Seely that negotiations were being carried on with the Union Castle Company he was not apprised by him of the details of the proposals or of the agreement finally concluded.

Accordingly before considering the matter further My Lords will be glad if Mr. Harcourt will enquire, as suggested in the third paragraph of the letter under reply, what proportion of married officers, when travelling with their wives and families, have hitherto travelled by the Messageries Maritimes Line.
