
I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 27th April last (11457/1911) and the accompanying copy of a despatch from the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate asking for a ruling whether the proceeds of a recent sale of godown and office plots at Kilindini, which realised Rs.28.685, may be credited to the Railway Capital Account.
