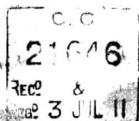

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 21st ultimo (1911/1911) relative to the differentiation between the salaries of pensionable and unpensionable European clerks in East Africa.

In reply I am to state that Their Lordships are willing to leave it to the Secretary of State for the Colonies to decide whether any of the non-pensionable European clerks should be placed on the permanent and pensionable establishment, provided always that the necessary adjustment in salary is made.
