In the circumstances represented in Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 9th ultimo (17467/1911) the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury sanction Mr. Secretary Harcourt's proposal

(1) to approve the lists of 'unhealthy' stations submitted by the Governors of the East Africa Protectorate and Nyasaland, and, with regard to Uganda, to accept the Governor's recommendation that the whole of the Protectorate should be classed as 'unhealthy';

(2) so long as the existing agreement with the Union Castle Company remains unaltered, to allow officers in the service of the East Africa Protectorate and Uganda proceeding on leave to take a steamer earlier than the one by which they are strictly entitled to travel, provided that the number of days by which their leave would thus be antedated in no case exceeded the number by which it would be postdated were a later steamer taken.
