There are vacancies for Temporary Medical Officers in East Africa, Uganda, and Nyasaland at a salary of £400 a year. I have had several disappointments over these posts and after sifting more than 20 candidates I am only able to submit three names for the six vacancies. The others will no doubt form the subject of submissions by Mr. Harding of candidates whose applications have come in during the last week or two. The precise allocation of the candidates I put forward for your approval should I think be left to the Department, who will be able to judge the relative urgency of the requirements of the three Protectorates.
